


TECH TALK: Ford's 1986 5.0 Liter H.O. Engine

With the 1986 models of the 5.0 liter H.O. (High Output) Engine, the carburetor pasted into history. What replaced it? The Electronic Fuel Injection. I am not talking a single nozzle spraying into the manifold; no, what we have here is eight matched high precision injectors rated at 19 LB/Hr mounted just in front on the intake valve. This is serious fuel injection. No more concern about routing the intake manifold runners to get a balanced mixture to all cylinders. Nope! Just nice long straight flow from the throttle plate to the injector, spray a measured amount of gas, BINGO!, perfect mixture. No more rich or lean cylinders.

Fuel injecting is not new. Is was first used in fighter aircraft where maneuvering could get a carburetor in to positions where it no longer worked. Chevrolet installed it on some of their Corvettes. These were mechancial systems relying on expensive pumps and fancy valves to get the job done, a compromise at best.

On the Ford unit, it is computer-controlled. The computer monitors the engine speed, the engine temperature, the air pressure on both sides of the throttle plate, the air temperature and the throttle position. Then the computer calculates the exact amount of fuel charge needed for one cylinder, then does it seven more times. We are going to get maximum energy out of every gallon of gas, lower exhaust emissions, and get smoother throttle response. The down side of this system is weekend mechanics won't be working on their fuel systems, but then again, the EPA has been trying to get people to stop fooling around with the carburetors for years. How could we mention the EPA and not state the MPG rating for the 1986 Mustang GT is 22.5 Miles Per Gallon.


