Rick's Tips

Volume 3



So far we have discussed rust prevention in the fenders. This issue we will concentrate on the doors. All rust in the doors on early Mustangs can be traced to dirt collecting in key areas. The secret to keeping rust down is to remove this dirt from the bottom of the doors. Once you have opened the door(s) check the drain holes on the underside of the doors. If these are clogged, use a coat hanger or a stick to clear them. Next run water thru the top of the window so that it flows thru the door. This should flush out any debris and keep dirt from collecting and causing rust out. When washing your car, always make sure the drain holes are free and clean.

For you home mechanics, remove the door panels and flush with water from the inside with window up. Once dry, use aluminum spray paint on the inside and bottom of the doors. Use liberally on all walls and door bottoms. This will keep the existing rust down and prevent any further problems.

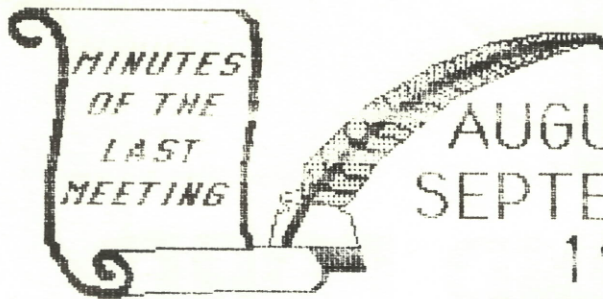

The regular monthly meeting of the Central Virginia Mustang Club was called to order on Wednesday, August 6, 1986 by President Terry Wagner at 7:30 P.M. at Cloverleaf Mall. CRUISES: Cruise night at Bill's Barbecue was scheduled for its regular night Saturday, August 9th near "The Diamond". REFRESHMENTS: Connie Callaham requested additional door prize donations. AWARDS & TROPHIES: Kent Callaham announced that "everything is go for the Car Show". Trophies and dash plaques were on order. A new Club jacket order is being assembled and will be placed when 20 deposits have been received. SPONSORS: Leroy Lilly asked anyone wishing to help in acquiring sponsors for the show to see him. PUBLICITY & NEWSLETTER: Tina Fritz again asked for contributions to the newsletter - tips, news items, show results, comments, suggestions, etc. NASCAR: Monte Evans encouraged anyone wanting tickets for the upcoming races to contact him. He said that he had not received any input up to this point. JUDGING: Carroll Lipscombe reported that nine people had showed up to participate in the judging meetings but more were needed. Everyone's help would be appreciated and welcomed. CARSHOW: Kenny Fischer suggested that everyone pre-register who would be entering an automobile. A live broadcast would emanate from the show

compliments of XL-102 radio station from 12-3PM. Volunteers are needed to help in all areas the day of the show. To help finance the costs of the show, a 2-Ton jack -or- a handmade quilt (made by Nellie Fischer's Grandma) would be raffeled at the regular Sept. meeting. Tickets would be \$1 each. PUBLICITY & NEWSLETTER: Tina Fritz read the show rules and asked for everyone's assistance in having the attendees and participants cooperate. Registration will being at 7:AM. Newspaper, TV and Radio ads were in full swing. 34 Cars were Pre-Registered and promises of 4 racing Mustangs to be on display. Anyone wishing to set up Friday afternoon was welcome. There would be security by Club members on the premises. The general public was expected from 10-5 with awards at 4. 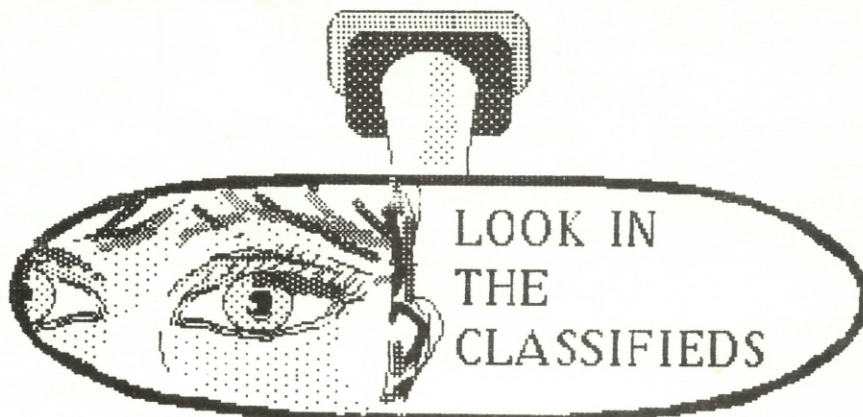

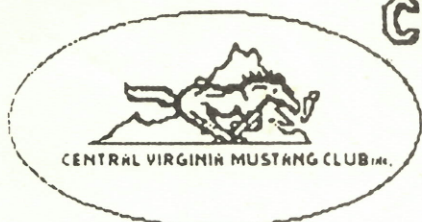
