I would like you all to be thinking about activities and events that would encourage your interest and participation. Finalization of the events calendar for the coming year should occur in January, February at the latest.



The trick is to create judging rules for dubs with a variety of members to serve as an umbrella for the range of styles and tastes without conflict. To date I don't feel we have discovered the secret judging formula, I'm certainly open to suggestions.

We are about to enter our 4th year and with that comes new challenges. If we all work together to meet the new year, we will surely rise to even greater club success and personal satisfaction.

Hurry now, we would like this survey to be in the next newsletter, so we can tally the results and reap some benefits from it.


Of all types of cars at the show, Mustangs dominated more than any other model. CVMC members outnumbered any other group attending and appeared to be having the best time (as usual).


If Whitepost decides to host an '88 Celebration, its worth your time and effort to plan a leisurly mountain weekend of friends, fun and fords next October.



WINTERIZATION INSIDE & OUT

- PART 1 -GARAGE KEPT CARS

EXTERIOR: Wash car and put a good protectant, such as #2 McQuires Resale & Glaze. Do not use wax at all on your car. Wax will destroy the paint (trust me on this). TIRES: Check inflation monthly. Original tires should be jacked up off the ground to prevent settling and cracking. Armour All: for protection. Let it soak in and do not wipe off for 1 hour. Re-soak and wipe off excess 1 hour later. ENGINE COMPARTMT: Spray all parts with WD-40 or Armour All to protect from moisture.

INTERIOR: Clean with good cleaner such as Fantastic or Vinyl Cleaner. Silicone or Armour All vinly, do not wipe off for 1 hour. Repeat with protectant and wait another hour to wipe off. I like to leave a good coat of Armour All on all vinyl then thru the Winter to stop cracking. Clean all chrome with a good chrome cleaner.

Armour All or spray with WD-40 for max protection. <u>SUSPENSION</u>: Degrease if desired. Spray with WD-40 or Armour All. Let drip; the more the better for good protection.

CAR COVER: A dust cover is all that is needed.

DRIVE YOUR CAR: At least once a month, check fluid levels before you drive.

Watch for leaks on the floor.

- PART 2 -CARS KEPT OUTSIDE

EXTERIOR: Wash weekly if

possible. Do not use wax for this will cause paint failure. Wash wheel wells and rinse all jams throughly. I personally like to rinse the underside of my car, knocking off mud and dirt. Dirt, if left underneath your car will begin to lift paint and cause rust out. **ENGINE COMPARTMENT:** Grease in an engine compartment is the best protection, however it looks bad. Degrease engine compartment thoroughly; coat with WD-40 or Armour All. INTERIOR: Clean interior thoroughly with vinyl cleaner or a household cleaner such as Fantastic. Silicone or Armour All all vinyl. Do not wipe off, let soak to protect vinyl from Winter temperatures. Remember, cold cracks plastic and vinyl. Protectants will keep it

soft. Use chrome cleaner on chrome. Spray with WD-40 to protect clean chrome. SUSPENSION: Leave grease buildup on suspension and add WD-40 after thoroughly rinsing with strong stream of water. If you degrease suspension, spray with WD-40 to keep rust from forming. Some of the best preserved suspensions I have seen had grease on them since they were new. CAR COVER: Consult local Club members for advice. A nice cover will cost \$120. Don't use plastic or tarps, they hold moisture and cause bad rust. DRIVE YOUR CAR: Drive a coupe of miles each month to keep lubricants from

settling. Always check fluids before driving and watch for leaks under car. If you have any questions call 222-8481 (days only). HAPPY CRUISIN'
