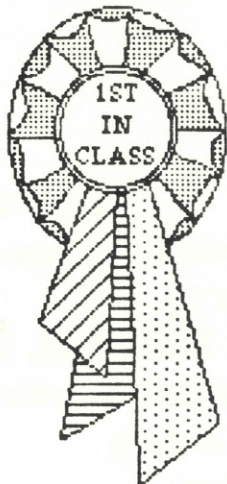
high number of attendance. Still in all, I believe that those who do attend have a very enjoyable time.

CLUB TAKES HONORS AGAIN

Since the last communication was abbreviated, I thought some additional press should be given to the members that attended car shows in November. The second weekend was spent out at the fairgrounds in the Commonwealth Building. It was the first time we tried to put together an officially planned Club display. A western theme was chosen. We used split-rail fence supplied by Spicer Fence Company. Mr. Spicer collected the fencing, cut it to size and nailed on the bases. The display at the Fairground had the cars lined up against a wall. We enclosed the cars with the railing and scattered pinebark chips around the cars. As decoration we had saddles, traces, horseshoes, campfires, stumps and several easels with Mustang Posters on them. Each of the cars had spotlights. The display took second place and each of the eight individuals won a trophy. For the small fee of \$50 we were able to keep all of the materials he provided.

Over Thanksgiving weekend, the Club participated in the Stars & Cars Custom Auto Show held in the Richmond Center downtown. This was a four day show with lots of entertaining activities sponsored by the show promoter. There were youngsters doing bike tricks, a muscle show, dance contest and more. Our Club members shared shifts selling programs at the door and earned close to \$100 for the Club treasury. Six members showed their Mustangs. Five in the Club display and Kenny Fischer showed as an independent ISCA display. We set the display up the same way as two weeks before with the exception of being in the center of the floor with the railing encircling the display. The results were again rewarding indeed:

If you only see the cars and never the owners, we have a neat little blue 5 X 7 "Greeting Card" which you can leave on a windshield with Club information on it.

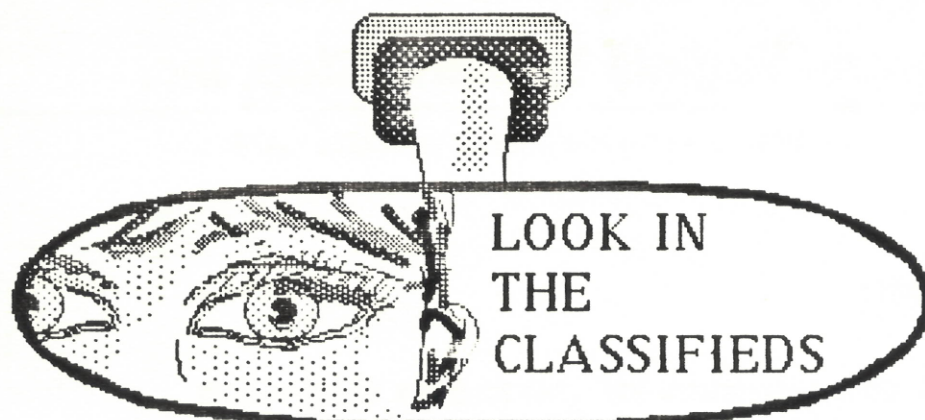

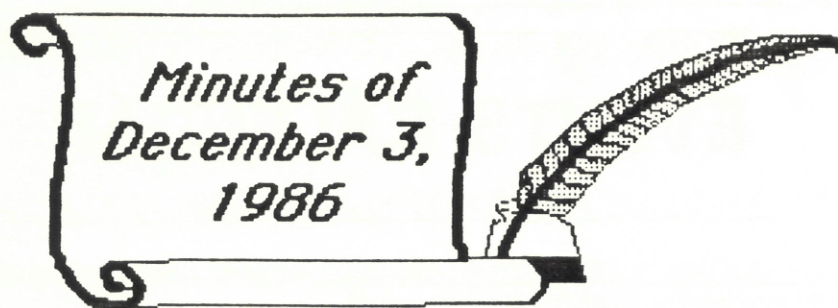

The regular monthly meeting of the Central Virginia Mustang Club was called to order on Wednesday, December 3, 1986 by President Terry Wagner at Richmond Ford at 4600 West Broad Street. The Treasurer's report was given by Tina Fritz. A total of \$1,964.95 was reported to be in the treasury with a total of 166 members. Terry asked committee chairmen with activity to present their reports. Kent Callaham advised he would take any orders for Club jackets but they would not arrive until sometime in January. Connie Callaham stated that she had a trouble light, donated by Sonny Coble for this evenings door prize. Bill Broughton advised that he had contacted several different places for a permanent meeting place for the Club. Regency Square Mall will be available in March or April for a fee of \$10 a meeting. Petersburg Ford has available room. Anyone with a suggestion for a meeting place should contact Bill. The Christmas party committee gave a report on changes concerning the party due to light ticket sales. Several members suggested there should be more free activities for Club members to attend. Projected costs and the party plans were explained for the justification of the ticket price.

OLD BUSINESS: A correction to the minutes of November's meeting was noted that the election of officers was omitted from the minutes but did appear in the last correspondence to the membership.

Questions were raised on the vote taken at the prior meeting concerning the Club paying half of the Club member's entry fee to non-Mustang shows. There was an open discussion on the pros and cons of the Club paying the entry fees. A motion was made and seconded to rescind the vote of the last meeting. NEW BUSINESS: Monte Evans stated that he would be taking names of anyone interested in participating in the March 15th ST. PATRICKS DAY PARADE. The parade has a 2 PM starting time. The parade route begins at Reynolds Metals on West Broad Street and ends at Willow Lawn.

Eric Selph stated that he had more Mustang whiskey decanters for sale. Anyone interested should contact Eric. (Editors Note: Eric is donating \$5 per Club member sale to the Club.)

BREAK! Five new members were recognized and welcomed to the Club. The drawing was held with Carroll Lipscombe winning the first time and donating the prize back to be redrawn. In the re-draw, Durwood Tedder, a new member was the door prize winner.

Discussion of raising the membership dues was postponed to the next meeting.

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Warren Wright reminded all members of the cruise at Bill's BBQ Saturday night, December 6th.

Rick's Tips

Volume 4

When Ford painted the early Mustangs, the cars were dipped in primer and allowed to drip dry. This accounts for the rows upon rows of drip mounds on your floor pans. The best way to keep rest off the floor pans is to hose with a strong stream of water to remove the dirt. Sand with 220 grit or stronger sandpaper. Clean surface and spray with aluminum paint to hold down fine rust and then spray with black paint for effect. Short of sandblasting, this is the best way to protect your floors.
