CLASSIC CAR CAYALCADE 1987 REPORT

As the minutes ticked away, the plans for the '87 Classic Car Cavalcade fell into place - just like clockwork. The CVMC exhibits a great deal of class through experience whenever there is a Club event to be organized and presented.

The pre-planning sessions were held month's earlier by Show Chairman Kenny Fischer to decide upon the general outline for this year's show. Fifteen Committee Chairman were selected to begin their various tasks to support the show.

Publicity Chairman Tina Fritz sent press releases to all the Mustang Magazines, local publications, TV, Radio and Cable Stations to alert them about the show. A letter was sent to 135 parts vendors asking for their support in the way of advertising or door prizes. And Mustang Parts houses were asked to send 100 catalogs to be used in our Catalog Collection.

Bill Thompson, Awards Chairman, began arranging for dash plaques, trophies and engraving. Even though Bill had another committment for the show weekend, he continued to followup and make sure that the awards portion of the show was handled.

Registration forms were reviewed from last year and Monte Evans interjected some good ideas on a numbering system and began to formulate a plan to get every one registered and in place so he would have time to work on preparing his car for the show.

Another committee handled judging. Carroll Lipscombe began the Chairmanship and had a committee
