BILL FORD ON INNOVATION

The compass has been set, and Ford Motor Company is moving in a new direction that embraces creativity and originality.

"We must unleash our spirit of American innovation," said Ford chairman and CEO Bill Ford Monday in remarks that were broadcast to employees throughout the world, as the company unveiled its strategy to restore profitability to its North American operations.

Creating a culture steeped in innovation is a key component of what the company calls its Way Forward plan.

"This company was founded by an inventor," said Ford. "We want to make sure that today the company is flowing with innovators."

Ford noted that in the past the company's spirit of innovation has been thwarted by what he referred to as "bureaucratic walls." He aims to change that.

"Today, we are moving from a culture that discourages innovation back to a company that celebrates it," said Ford. "We recently sent out a mailing to 120,000 U.S. dealers, employees and retirees asking for ideas. Going forward, our employee evaluations will include a section on innovation."

Ford said that the company will design compensation plans to reward employees for new ideas.

"And we're going to create a way for employees to appeal a decision even if they have an idea and the boss says no," he said.

After Ford declared the importance of innovation in a speech at the Ford Research and Innovation Center in September, thousands of employees responded to the call for action, and Ford says that many of the ideas submitted are very promising.

"To me, innovation is seeing what others can't see and using that vision to build what others have never built," he said.

Ford cited examples of innovation currently underway in the areas of safety, fuel efficiency and environmental sustainability at the Rouge Plant.

"Despite cynicism and institutional barriers, we built the most progressive assembly plant in the world," he said, referring to the Rouge facility. "Over time, the Rouge will save us millions of dollars not just because of its green roof, but in energy costs like heating, cooling and lighting. Projects like these need to be the rule, and not the exception."

Another example of innovation is the Piquette Project, a new product development "think tank," which is mentioned in this week's Time magazine featuring Bill Ford on the cover. Named after the historic Detroit plant in which the Model T was conceived in 1908, it's a well-guarded project that seeks to create recyclable, environmentally- friendly cars of the future. In the past, Ford said, the Piquette Project would have never gotten further than a meeting room. Today, he sees it as an example of where the company is headed in the future.

Answering a reporter's question about the project, Ford said, "It's bringing together our best and brightest minds and applying them truly with

a clean sheet of paper saying 'what will the transportation needs of the future be... and how do we turn that into a commercial prospect?' "

Ford made several references in his remarks to his great-grandfather Henry Ford. One in particular was an anecdote about a time a hundred years ago when Henry Ford built his first car in a shed behind his house.

"At the end, after he was finished, he realized there was one thing he hadn't anticipated. The car was too big to go out the door. He actually had to knock down a wall to drive it out," he said. "We intend to remind people every day that if you want to build something that's never been built before, you may have to knock down a wall or two."

MCA continues to exert a positive influence on the Mustang automobile and its popularity. This influence helps retain the interest and value of all years and models of Mustangs.

There are MCA Regional Clubs located throughout the United States. There are also several International Affiliates.

MCA members elect the national board of directors and may run for the board or other national office. That was a program that MCA started to give the club a rebate of \$10. for each new MCA member they submitted to MCA and a code number to use. It has now expired, but was scheduled to be re-induced at this January board meeting. I will be checking on this,

There are several MCA National shows this year that some of you may want to also attend:

1. The 1st one is May 26 to 28 @ Johnson City, TN. & is around 360 miles from Richmond with an estimated 6 hours drive time. The show site @ the TN State University.
2. The next one is July 14 to 16 @ Sturbridge, MA & is around 500 miles from Richmond with an estimated 10 hours drive time. The show site @ the Sturbridge Host hotel & Conference Center.
3. The 3rd one is August 11 to 13 @ Erie, PA & is around 466 miles from Richmond with an estimated 8 hours drive time. The show site @ the Mill creek Mall Pavilion.
4. The 4th one is September 1 to 4 @ Birmingham, AL & is around 690 miles from Richmond with an estimated 11 hours drive time. There will be no Grand National as it will be combined with MCA's 30th birthday celebration. There will be more on this show from Rusty Wiseman.

My past experiences on going to MCA National shows, especially Grand Nationals, is to make your hotel registrations just as soon as possible because they book fast. You can always cancel later.



News From The Car Club Council of Central Virginia

HB 288 – what a mess! This bill has been a real nightmare for hobbyists. The bill was pre-filed in December by the sponsor Delegate Danny Marshall. This bill corrects some of the years in which the state only issued one plate; it puts in stronger language about misusing tags and reduced pleasure driving from 250 miles to 50 miles.

No one contacted the car councils or car hobbyists to get input before this bill was filed. Some members of the Assembly have stated that they have spoken to hobbyists and said they are OK with the bill. We haven't been able to find these car hobbyists.

In fact we do not know of any car hobbyist or citizen who has asked for this measure. There has been no outcry to fix a problem that may or may not exist.

And those who have contacted members of the House Transportation Committee have been left confused by the answers to their questions. Currently (January 27th) we have been told the bill will be amended to include 250 miles of pleasure driving; it will be amended to include the formation of a committee to study the misuse of antique tags and what to do about it – members to include DMV, State Police and “car hobbyists”; plus there is serious discussion about requiring

vehicles registered as antiques to be inspected. Apparently they have learned that inspecting Model T's and older vehicles would be a mess so now they are looking at inspections for vehicles built in the 60's and later.

You may think that since you own an antique older than 1960 that you won't have to get your car inspected. That will only last a year. If they knew how to inspect Model T's then they would require them to get inspected!

I do not understand why HB 288 was introduced before a study was done to determine the best course of action to stop the misuse of antique plates. Inspecting some antique vehicles would punish the many to attempt to stop the few violators. Please note the following:

1. How will police officers (who were not around in the 50's and 60's) determine which antiques are 1959's or 1960's so they will know which ones are violating the law? Will they just stop every vehicle registered as an antique? How can anyone set a cutoff year?
2. I know from conversations with local police officers that few are aware of the antique vehicle registration law – how will they be informed?
3. How much will it cost to mail letters to the owners of the antique vehicles?
4. Why isn't DMV making any administrative changes to stop the misuse of antique plates? Why are they relying on enforcement only?
5. Those who are registering vehicles as antiques to avoid inspections will not take their vehicles in to be inspected – only the honest will comply.
6. If inspections are about safety then why is there an exemption from seat belts in vehicles that came with them from the factory?

The VAACC members – all four car councils – have problems with this legislation. We have some real concerns with HB 288. When was the last time you heard of the crash of an antique vehicle caused by something that would be spotted in a state safety inspection? There hasn't been one. Does anyone really believe that a committee with members of the State Police and DMV will really listen to the concerns of car hobbyists? And why should they – there are members of the General Assembly that don't.

HB 288, if it becomes law, will force changes to the car hobby without the consent or input of car hobbyists. And that is its major problem. We are the ones who have tried to find solutions to the misuse of antique plates yet we have been ignored by DMV and some members of the Assembly.

I urge you to ask your delegate to vote against 288 no matter what amendments are made to it. This bill could be amended to who knows what! It's a poor attempt to solve a "perceived" problem by the easiest possible way and does not provide a real workable solution.

Investing

I write this article every so often for those of you who have a spouse that is complaining about your old Mustang.

Usually the spouse does not understand the purchase, restoration or up keep of a vintage Mustang. In other words, why is my significant other spending money on an old beat up, banged up, rusty, smoking hulk that looks something like an automobile. Relax it will take a while to bring your spouse around but here is how you do it.

To begin, you must tell the actual purchase price and back it up with current data showing value including NADA (the most accurate), selling prices in current magazines, E-bay, etc. It may take a while for this to sink in but if you back up your price by sources other than yourself you are on the right track.

I do not suggest disclosing work performed or parts purchased as these will cut the original value. If you do upgrade your investment be able to justify the increase of value again through outside sources.

The next part is easy if you followed the previous steps. The value of Mustangs is going up by leaps and bounds. It is important to continue to show increasing values to justify your investment. When your spouse realizes

that you are making money by enjoying your hobby they will not complain but compliment you and be impressed with your investment for the future.
