Ford Mustang Ready For Pony Car War With Camaro, Challenger

StangsUnleashed.com - It's the 1960s all over again - Ford scores a hit with the redesigned Mustang and the next thing you know the competitors are launching an all out Pony Car war. Looming in the Mustang's shadow are a revived versions of the competition's classic muscle cars. Is Ford worried?

"We embrace the Pony wars," said James Owens, Mustang marketing manager. "Mustang is the authentic American muscle car. In fact, Mustang is the only one of the original pony cars from the 1960s to live on into the 21st century with no interruption in production."

That production streak looks destined to continue with sales up more than 30 percent in September of 2006 over the same period in 2005. And Mark Fields, executive vice president and president, the Americas, announced in September that one new Mustang variation would be introduced every year.

Both consumers and auto writers embraced the major Mustang redesign in 2004. "Whether you choose a V6 or V8, a coupe or convertible, this is one of the best values on the market for consumers seeking traditional rear-wheel-drive performance," wrote the editors of Edmunds.com.

"Mustang has two kinds of buyers," Owens said. "People under 40 and people over 40. That sounds like a joke but its true. Our target customer "Drew" is a younger person who likes the Mustang because its basically cool.

But our consumption customer is the baby boomer. These are people who no longer need the mini van or SUV and who fondly remember the Mustang of their youth."

To give an idea of the popularity of the Mustang to boomers, in February of this year, 70 percent of Mustang buyers did not bring a car for trade in. "Empty Nesters" who now find themselves with incremental disposable income just want to tool around town in The American Pony Car.

Young or old, buyers have four basic Mustang variations to choose from: Coupe or Convertible, available in Deluxe or Premium Arrays, in both GT and V6. For true nostalgia, there's the V-6 Pony Package which includes a unique Pony grille, fog lights, stripes, 17-inch wheels and rear spoiler.

All 2007 Ford Mustangs come with an auxiliary input jack for MP3 players, while Sirius satellite radio is a new option. Late in the model year, a DVD-based navigation system will also be available. Seventeen-inch wheels are now a stand-alone option on V6 models.

A new Comfort Package with heated seats, six-way power adjustments for the front-passenger seat and an auto-dimming rearview mirror is available on V6 Premium and all GT models. There are also a couple of new trim packages for the GT. Offered in all 50 states, the original west coast wild thing The 68 GT Cal Special comes back to life in 2007 This package harkens back to the original with black leather seats with contrasting Dove or Parchment inserts; revised front and rear fascias; side scoops; 18-inch Polished Aluminum wheels; "GT/CS" door stripes and polished exhaust tips. The GT Appearance Package offers just the exhaust tips, a hood scoop and an engine cover with the pony emblem. Additionally, Grabber Orange has been added as an exterior paint choice.

Whether or not the Mustang's rivals these rivals will put a dent in Mustang's popularity is anyone's guess. For now, Mustang is

determined to remain the top pony in the corral.



Ford Fusion, Mercury Milan, Zephyr Score Top Quality

TheFusionSource.com - Ken Grody says quality is one of the key reasons his dealership in Carlsbad, Calif., is selling a lot of Ford Fusions. He has noticed that Fusion customers rarely come in with service problems and believes that's driving sales.

"People come in to change the oil and that's about it, and the word is starting to get out," he said. "For us, the Fusion is really beginning to establish a beachhead against the imports."

To the north in New Brunswick, Ontario, Dave Emerson, owner of Riverview Ford, is experiencing similar customer feedback.

"We never see them in the shop," he said. "Once we sell them, they just don't come back for repairs. The quality has been excellent."

Beyond anecdotal evidence on quality from dealers, Ford corporate research shows that the Ford Fusion, Mercury Milan and Lincoln Zephyr had the best quality showing of any vehicle in Ford's long history.

Ford's year-end Global Quality Research System survey (GQRS) shows the three mid-size sedans have the lowest number of Things Gone Wrong (TGW) for any of the company's first-year vehicles. They

also outpaced former segment leaders, Toyota Camry and Honda Accord.

"That is exceptional for a start-up," said Enrique Delannoy, assistant chief engineer for the program. "In most vehicles at the beginning of a program, the quality tends to suffer, but with the Fusion, Milan and Zephyr, we've been at the top of the segment right from the very beginning. It's a real testament not only to our launch team engineers but to everyone at the plant in Hermosillo, as well."

According to the GQRS, the Milan had 1,149 TGW and the Fusion had 1,172 TGW, just behind the Dodge Stratus with 1,066 and the Chevy Malibu with 1,073 and ahead of the Toyota Camry with 1,193 and the Honda Accord with 1,353. The rankings reflect things gone wrong per 1,000 vehicles at three months service.

In the mid-size luxury class, the Lincoln Zephyr had 1,119 TGW, second only to the Lexus 330 with 943.

The number of warranty repairs for mid-size entries also set a company record. With an average of 116 repairs per 1,000 vehicles after three months in service, the Fusion and Milan registered the lowest retail warranty repair rate of any Ford vehicle ever sold.

Warranty numbers for Powertrain are just as impressive. The Fusion and Milan are averaging 16.5 repairs per 1,000 vehicles and the Zephyr is averaging 16.3 repairs per 1,000, the lowest levels ever achieved at Ford.

"We're exceptionally excited, but not surprised," said Fusion launch manager Kate Pearce.

"The team that created those vehicles from concept to production has been relentless in making sure that every component used was the best quality. Those results are not an accident."

Along with the JD Power APEAL award for design, Fusion was recognized by Smart Money and Consumers Digest for best value and Parent Magazine as the best family

car. Pearce and the launch team point to the Strategic Vision Total Quality Award given to the Fusion for best quality in the hotly contested medium-size category. The Milan came in second.

"It's funny how the quality story never gets told," said Art Spinella, the president of CNW Marketing Research, a consulting firm in Bandon, Ore., that tracks auto industry trends. "I don't care which survey you look at, they all say the same thing. While Toyota and Honda continue to make improvements, other automakers like Ford are moving at a faster pace and, in many cases, they now offer better vehicles."

While the GQRS numbers and the growing trophy case of awards are important, Spinella says the only real way the story of Ford quality will get out to the public is through word-of-mouth, and that takes time.

"We've done a lot of research on the word-of-mouth issue, and we've found it's the only message that consumers truly believe, and that doesn't happen overnight," he said. "Enough people have to buy the car in the first place before they can spread the word."

In the meantime, the Fusion launch team says it's working to give consumers something else to talk about.

"We want those vehicles to be best in their segment," said Jim Saad, the leader of the Fusion Quality Process team, who added, "We are so close."

It's that mentality that Pearce says is being passed on to other Ford products, including the Edge and the new Focus.

"The Fusion, Milan and Zephyr are just the first ones," she said.

"From now on, everything else will be held to the same standard. This is just the beginning."

KENSETH REGAINS POINT LEAD

Martinsville, Va. — Matt Kenseth moved back into the NASCAR Nextel Cup Series points lead following an 11th-place finish at Martinsville Speedway in the Subway 500. Kenseth now stands 36 points ahead of second place Kevin Harvick, despite Kenseth's 11th place finish today.

Kenseth spoke at a post-race press conference.

"We didn't run very good. We kind of did the pit thing, I thought, right at the end, and got tires and we were decent there.

"Whatever the heck we're doing not racing back to the cautions lost us two spots. [Kevin] Harvick passed two of us through the wreck—which isn't his fault, he had a hole to go through there. They left him in front of us so they just gave him two free spots, so that was frustrating. And then when it was time to pass him, I got ran into the fence twice, so that was frustrating as well. We didn't have a great car and we didn't get a lot of room out there.

"Toward the end I just did the best I could with it, and the guys on pit road did a great job, and we salvaged something out of it."

WERE YOUR STRUGGLES HERE TODAY THE SAME AS IN THE PAST, OR SOMETHING DIFFERENT?

"We had our balance halfway decent a couple of times. We couldn't get any speed out of car all weekend long, really. So, it was about what we expected. We did a good job on pit road. We kept our nose clean, basically, on the track, and got something out of it.

"We didn't run very good. We didn't run as good as them guys who had better tires at the end, and if we could've not had a caution every four laps we probably could've gotten something a little better out of it."

YOUR LEAD IS 36 POINTS WITH FOUR RACES TO GO. DOES THAT MEAN MUCH?

"It means we're 36 points on the other guy.

"We've still got to go four more weeks and we've got to run good. You know, we haven't run good in this Chase. We ran good at Dover [International Speedway], we ran good to win, we ran good at Talladega [Superspeedway] and other that we haven't looked like a championship team. So, I'm more than excited about the point lead, I'm disappointed with the way the end of the race went—the way I got raced there a little bit. I couldn't have expected more of a performance here.

"The guys did a great job on pit road, we just didn't have a fast car all weekend. It's great to be the leader, but we've got to go start running good. All year we could run with the 48 [Jimmie Johnson] and the 24 [Jeff Gordon] and them guys—we haven't been able to do it lately, and we got to go do it at Atlanta and the next races after that."

WHAT ABOUT THE CAUTIONS TODAY. DID ONE BREED ANOTHER? OR WERE SOME DRIVING OVER THEIR HEADS TODAY?

"I don't know. The only wreck I saw was when I got spun out. So, other than that, I didn't see any of them so I don't have any idea what caused them all. When you get to the

end of the race, a lot of times a lot of cautions."

DOES ANYBODY HAVE ANYTHING GOING IN THIS CHAMPIONSHIP? IT LOOKED LIKE JEFF BURTON DID, BUT HE HAD PROBLEMS AND OPENED IT ALL UP.

"I don't know, it's been pretty sloppy so far. There's been some guys who have run real good, but everybody's had a little bit of trouble. We probably had the least amount of trouble, but we just haven't run as good as we know we're capable of—that we did the first two-thirds of the year. So, it's still pretty wide open.

"It's going to be exciting, I think, coming down the last race. I'm glad we're in the lead and if we can get going back on these last four tracks like we were earlier in the year I think we've got a shot at it. But, we've got to get running better."



ROUSH RETOOLING

Martinsville, Va. — Look for a major reshuffling of personnel next year at Roush Racing, with a possibility that all five crew chiefs for the powerhouse Ford team could change.

Team owner Jack Roush said Sunday that the crew chief jobs for his three teams that didn't make the Chase are open questions, and that the pending departure of Mark Martin from the No. 6 Ford Fusion and arrival of David Ragan could mean a change is warranted there.

And Matt Kenseth's crew chief, Robbie Reiser, has indicated a desire to move off the pit box and into a

management job. Add it up and a lot of change is in the wind at Roush.

"I believe that the best relationship between a driver and a crew chief in the traditional sense is maybe three years," Roush said Sunday.

"Certainly not more than five years to get the most out of everybody that's involved. We're approaching that timetable on some of the programs where certainly I've got reason to believe based on my experience that by moving some people around—not moving people out, not moving people in—but by moving people around within our existing structure, may be more useful going forward."

November 2006 Car Hobbyist News From the Council

The next meeting of the DMV Task Force will be on Thursday November 2nd. I will post the events of the meeting on the car club council website the next day. At the last meeting we revealed part of our plan to stop the misuse of antique plates: require a vehicle registered as a daily driver in the family/residence of the person who is requesting an antique tag and the requirement of stated value or antique insurance for vehicles registered as an antique. The stated value insurance requirement would stop the use of antique tags by clunkers and rusty pickups – these vehicles would not qualify for that insurance. It would also stop the proliferation of antique tag junkyards. We have already heard complaints about several uninsured vehicles rusting away in yards with antique tags on them. There is a state law that allows people to keep parts and project vehicles as long as they are out of ordinary view. A yard full of antique tagged vehicles in plain view looks like an eyesore and is not good public relations for car hobbyists.

I have seen the letter written to DMV by an insurance lobbyist who says he represents the companies in Virginia that write 60% of the insurance policies. He makes it clear in the letter that insurance companies do not want to comply with any new requirements for antique vehicles. This is the opposite of what we have heard from insurance companies that sell stated value antique vehicle insurance.

If his companies do not wish to insure us then we will buy from the other 40%. I could not discover if he lobbies for companies that specialize in antique vehicle insurance. I am going to try and get the names of the companies he represents and make them known to hobbyists.

Regardless of what happens at the DMV meeting car hobbyists have heard from members of the General Assembly who are ready to sponsor measures to end the misuse of antique plates. They will rely heavily on our plan to end the misuse. One thing I am going to try and obtain is the removal of miles from the antique registration. The 250 miles of pleasure driving has caused us a lot of trouble and is unenforceable. I think that replacing the 250 miles with occasional recreational driving and then defining it will be much better for hobbyists. We would still be able to occasionally drive and enjoy our old vehicles without causing some to think that they should drive 250 miles each and every day. The 250 miles has caused us a lot of problems. Antique plates are restricted and we need to keep them that way.

I want to urge all car hobbyists to get out and vote on Election Day. It's the American thing to do. The last few years we have seen very little activity on the national level that would affect car hobbyists. The federal government has been occupied with terrorism, wars in Iraq and Afghanistan, the economy and many other issues. The fight for car hobbyist rights is at the state and local government levels. As we contact more members of the General Assembly and local elected officials we are quickly learning who our friends are and are also learning that there are some that just don't care. The number of local General Assembly members who never replied to requests to attend our legislative forum stunned me. They could have phoned, faxed or emailed a response and they do have staffs that are paid for with our tax dollars. We need to remember these GA members when

they run for re-election. We also need to remember the local constitutional officers that either ignore or make up their own interpretations of state antique vehicle laws.

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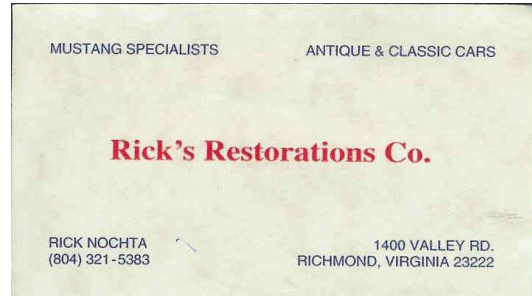
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
