We will leave to come home after the closing ceremonies on Sunday, June 22, 2008.



MUSTANG TEAM GOES EXTRA MILE TO DISCERN NEEDS AND WANTS OF PERFORMANCE CAR OWNERS

Ford goes to great lengths to gather firsthand quality and satisfaction data from customers. Mustang owners are passionate about their pony cars and generally more satisfied than owners of competitive makes.

DEARBORN, Mich., May 21, 2008 - There are more Mustangs on the road in Tampa, Fla., than anywhere else in the country, so Paul Randle and his team headed south.

The Mustang chief engineer gathered about 40 of the vehicle line's key team members - those responsible for everything from product development to personalization to marketing - and flew from Dearborn to Florida to interview nearly 70 performance car owners last month. In addition to those pulling up in Mustangs, participants included owners of competitive-make vehicles such as the Dodge Charger, Pontiac GTO and Mitsubishi Eclipse.

External customer clinics on the Mustang are coordinated annually by Ford's 6-Sigma Center, but this is the first time since the launch of the 2005 Mustang that the team included competitive-make owners as well. To ensure that owners would be candid with their opinions, the team presented itself as a market research group and didn't identify themselves as Ford employees.

"We wanted to find out why people purchased the Mustang and what else they'd shopped for," says Ronnie Ahmad, project specialist, 6-Sigma Center. "We added competitive-make owners to the mix not only to find out why they hadn't chosen a Mustang, but also to see if Mustang owners would stand tall when talking about their vehicles versus the others during the panel discussions."

Stand tall they did. Overall, Mustang owners were found to be very satisfied with their ownership experience. Far more complaints came from competitive-make owners. Based on this and a wealth of other findings, Ahmad says the new approach paid off: "It was way beyond our expectations."

Participants were paid \$120 for the hour-and-a-half experience. Upon arrival, each group of a dozen or so owners filled out a brief survey before sitting down for a videotaped panel discussion. The talks were led by a moderator who used the survey responses as a jumping-off point, and viewed live behind closed doors by the Ford team.

"It was very interesting to hear the pride in Mustang owners' voices," says Ahmad. "One woman said that having a Mustang is like having a Transformer - her car makes her feel like a superhero."

Mustang Vehicle Integration Supervisor Dean Nowicki says the experience opened his eyes to how much of an "impulse purchase" the Mustang seems to be. "We heard a lot of, 'I saw it, I wanted it, I bought it,'" Nowicki says. "One person brought her old V6 Mustang to the dealership for an oil change and left in a new GT."

Underscoring why Mustang owners are extremely passionate, the car has recently garnered accolades for quality and safety. Last year, the iconic pony car came out on top in three major consumer surveys sponsored by J.D. Power & Associates. All three - the Initial Quality Study (IQS), the Automotive Performance, Execution and Layout (APEAL) Study, and the Vehicle Dependability Study (VDS) - named Mustang as the leader in its mid-size Sporty Car segment. In addition, the 2008 Mustang convertible became the first sports car and the first convertible to earn the highest possible safety ratings in new-car tests performed by the U.S. government. The Mustang coupe also earned five stars in frontal crash tests for both driver and passenger, in side impact for driver and in rollover tests.

In Tampa, after each of the five panel discussions, participants retired to their cars for a walk-around focused on TGW (things gone wrong) and customer satisfaction issues. The information gathered will help the Mustang team make decisions about future features, as well as help immediately address any areas of concern.

"It was great to have a multifunctional group there, because we each picked up on something different when hearing the various responses," says Jackie DiMarco, Mustang business manager. "Later, as we're talking about which actions to take, our minds go to the images of the customers who made particular comments. This personalizes our decisions and helps us remember that everything we do is for the customer."

That idea delights Linda Davis, who participated in the clinic as the first owner of a 2008 Mustang convertible outfitted in the Warriors in Pink package designed in support of Susan G. Komen Race for the Cure. "I've been completely satisfied with my Mustang since buying it last July," Davis said. "I was happy to sit alongside other Mustang owners and hear similar comments. If clinics like

this help Ford, I'm pleased to participate."

Customer clinics have led to key product edits in the past. For example, comments from Ford Edge owners resulted in the resolution of glare from the instrument panel, and Ford Escape owners helped identify the need for better communication about the vehicle's reversible cargo mat.

"A vehicle team needs to have a visceral understanding of their customer, and we'll never get that just by looking at GQRS numbers," Nowicki said. "It's great to review numbers - we do that all the time - but when I can look in a customer's eye and see the emotion as they talk about their car, that's exceptional."

**DOUBLE PODIUM KEEPS
FORD AHEAD IN WORLD
TITLE

Olbia, Sardinia — BP Ford Abu Dhabi World Rally Team finished second and third in an enthralling Rally d'Italia Sardegna today to retain the lead in both the manufacturers' and drivers' standings in the Federation Internationale de L'Automobile World Rally Championship

Mikko Hirvonen and Jarmo Lehtinen claimed second in a Ford Focus RS World Rally Car, with Jari-Matti Latvala and Miikka Anttila third in a similar car. Ford preserves its seven-point advantage in the manufacturers' series while Hirvonen is three points ahead in the drivers' table.

This sixth round of the 15-rally series was the first European gravel fixture of the season. Based in the north-east of Sardinia, the three-day event was characterised by tough narrow tracks south of Olbia.

Competitors tackled 17 speed tests covering 344.73km, and despite heavy rain before the start, the rally itself was dry, although cloudy skies ensured temperatures were cooler than expected.

Hirvonen and Latvala began today's final leg in equal second place, tied to the tenth of a second. Both endured a disappointing opening day when Hirvonen struggled for speed after being first in the start order on roads covered by slippery loose gravel, and Latvala dropped more than 90sec with a puncture. However, the Finns fought back yesterday to take first and second on every stage to reel in leader Sébastien Loeb and start today just 29.4sec behind.

Both drivers ate into the Frenchman's lead during the opening three special stages, Hirvonen leading the charge. But when they realised the time gap was too big, they eased their pace, content to settle for podium positions. Twenty-seven-year-old Hirvonen won two tests today and eventually finished just 10.6sec behind Loeb and 4.7sec ahead of his 23-year-old team-mate.

"The first stage this morning was great but I went off the road briefly on the next about 1km after the start," said Hirvonen. "I hit a rock and didn't know what damage I had done so I knew I had to ease off slightly. I thought I had a puncture but Pirelli's tyres are strong and the rubber stayed inflated. At one point I was worried I wouldn't make the finish. This afternoon I started to go flat out to try to take time from Loeb, but I realised

it wasn't going to happen so I decided not to take any more risks and dropped my pace. Jari-Matti's split times were good so I couldn't ease off too much.

"I needed more speed on Friday but apart from that, this was a good rally. If I continue to lead the championship and be first in the start order, then I need to find more speed on the first day when conditions are slippery. If I can't win, then I need to take second and that's what I did here," he added.

Latvala won 10 of the 17 tests and was delighted with a podium after sliding to 14th following Friday's error when his car hit a bank and punctured. "It was a shame as after that I did so well. On Friday I would have been happy to finish in the top five, so third is fantastic and gives me a big confidence boost. If I hadn't made the mistake, who knows what the outcome might have been," he said.

"This morning I had a big fight with Mikko and I should have driven better. I had a good road position for two days and today I didn't. I didn't have the same confidence because the roads were slippery and there wasn't the same flow. I saw that I couldn't catch Mikko so I started to ease off. I was tracking his split times during the stage and followed his pace but I didn't want to take stupid risks to try to pass him. Mikko won the fight on the morning stages and second belonged to him," added Latvala.

Abu Dhabi's Khalid Al Qassimi and co-driver Michael Orr were 16th in another Focus RS, finishing under SupeRally rules after crashing yesterday. "I didn't drive well this morning, the stages were narrow and I wasn't confident. Things were much better in the afternoon when I built up confidence. Driving in this rally for the first time with new pace notes was a learning curve," said Al Qassimi.

BP Ford Abu Dhabi team director Malcolm Wilson was delighted with the weekend. "We decided that it wasn't realistic to catch Loeb and our drivers were happy to settle for their positions. Yesterday was very special,

and I'm not sure anyone has taken that kind of time out of Loeb in a single day when he was fighting for victory and that bodes well for the future. Road position was more crucial here than we thought, and that was a surprise, but our cars ran reliably all rally," he said.

Ford of Europe motorsport director Mark Deans said: "Despite a truly committed charge to secure the win, the significance of maximising our points in the manufacturers' championship wasn't missed by the drivers and as a result we've maintained our seven point lead in the standings. That's a reassuring position in which to be as we head into the tough rallies in Greece and Turkey."

NEWS FROM OUR RIVALS

Sébastien Loeb (Citroen) claimed a record 40th world rally win with his fourth success of the season. Stobart's Gigi Galli (Ford) took fourth with Dani Sordo (Citroen) and Chris Atkinson (Subaru) rounding off the top six. Ninth for Per-Gunnar Andersson gave Suzuki the final manufacturers' point. Today's only major retirement was Toni Gardemeister (Suzuki), who stopped after an electrical fire.

NEXT ROUND

The championship remains in the Mediterranean when round seven takes the team to Greece later this month. The all-gravel Acropolis Rally of Greece is based in Athens on 29 May - 1 June.

June 2008 Car Hobbyist News From the Council

This is a first – there are now greenhouse gas fees in the San Francisco area. The Bay Area Air Quality Management District has decided to charge businesses 4.4 cents per ton of carbon dioxide they emit. Nowhere else in the United States is there a carbon dioxide tax. A carbon dioxide tax is not good news because other localities may look at this as an additional way to make money.

Soon our own General Assembly will meet and try for the third year in a row to come up with transportation funding. They tried civil remedial fees for bad drivers and that didn't work. Many people believe the only way to come up with enough money is a gas tax increase. We are paying less than our neighboring states. And wouldn't the General Assembly had looked smart if – three years ago – they upped and gas tax a

penny? The daily increasing of the price of gasoline makes a gas tax look foolish right now. Currently projects are being delayed because of a lack of funding. I'm hoping for some creative solutions.

Wouldn't it be nice if the price of gas would stay that same for say a couple of days in a row? The US Senate hauled the heads of the five major oil companies in for an explanation of why gasoline prices keep going up and why their profits keep setting new records. One of the big oil CEO's stated that we are in a current "up cycle" and they need to make money for investment when they are no longer in an "up cycle". Since when has gasoline been in a "down cycle"? The five companies made \$36 billion in the last quarter.

When asked about their salary only one CEO knew his – 12.5 million. Four of them didn't know how much they made – or could it be they didn't want to tell? And the guy with 12.5 million must not have been adding in deferred compensation, bonuses, benefits, etc.

Our government has known for over 30 years that gasoline prices and supply are problematic. Other than kowtow to big oil and its lobbyists and waste millions in taxpayer money on hydrogen fuel cell and electric cars our government leaders have done nothing.

The environmentalists have won. We can't drill in places in this country where there is oil. A refinery hasn't been built since 1976. We can't build nuclear power plants. They have won – and I'm sure they are happy that record gasoline prices have reduced driving.

So we can thank our government leaders for taking lobbyist dollars. And we can thank environmentalists for their part in this mess. Remember it's not just high gas prices but the record fuel costs are pushing up the price of everything and sending our economy into serious trouble.


