For the annual Carlisle Ford Nationals this year the staff will have something special in store for those attending this show June 3rd to the 5th. 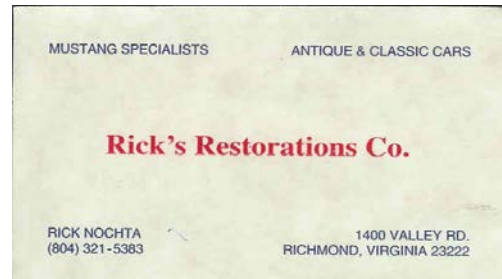

MARCH 2016 CAR HOBBYIST NEWS FROM THE COUNCIL

The General Assembly is in still session and the Virginia Association of Car Councils website has the listing of all auto-related bills at <http://vaacc.org/legis1.html>. The bill of most interest was HB 1119 sponsored by Delegate Nick Rush. This bill would have allowed freedom of

choice in exhaust system parts. As expected it was killed in committee. I have emailed information to the delegate and hopefully next session we will be able to get someone to sponsor a bill to extend the freedom of exhaust choices from pre-1950 vehicles to pre-1975 vehicles, before emissions and catalytic converters.

Allow me to give an update on the bills I mentioned in last month's news. The bill to allow motorcycles to have 5 instead of 4 front lights looks like it may become law. The free use of toll roads by motorcycles was killed. The law to allow motorcyclists to not wear a helmet was killed and similar bills have been defeated for several years.

There were 10 bills on passing stopped school buses and allowing tickets to be mailed to offenders who pass the buses. This is still pending. There is one bill left that would raise the threshold for reckless driving from going 80 to 85 miles per hour. The bill to make it illegal to smoke with young children in a vehicle is still alive.

A bill to prevent a person registered as a sex offender from buying special license plates relating to children or children's programs is still alive. The bill to allow kids to play in the street with toy cars/vehicles on streets where the speed limit is 25 or less was killed. The bill that would have required all motor vehicles to burn headlights all the time was also killed. The repeal bill for photo red was killed. It looks like the bill to require car dealers to disclose that a vehicle has been recalled will pass.

The motor vehicle bumper bill that would have reduced the required bumper height from 14 to 9 inches from the ground was killed.

The bill for a new special license plate with "STOP GUN VIOLENCE" was killed along with another license plate bill that would have allowed the use of a logo or emblem on the Sons of

Confederate Veterans special license plates. "PROTECT POLLINATORS" – this bill changes the special license plates for Protect Pollinators from nonrevenue sharing to revenue sharing and provides for the moneys to be allocated to the Virginia Department of Transportation to aid in the Pollinator Habitat Program. That bill is still alive in committee.

The civil asset forfeiture program allows the police/government to seize property even if a person has not been charged with a crime. There were three bills to change the Commonwealth's burden of proof to clear and convincing evidence from preponderance of the evidence in proving that the property is subject to forfeiture in civil asset forfeiture cases. Only one bill is still left and in committee at the time of this writing.

Next month I will update the bill status again or you may check the VAACC website for updates.

On the federal level there has been some interesting news. The EPA's power plant plan has come under fire and the Supreme Court scheduled a hearing. If the plan is defeated it could also take out the recent UN climate change accord. However, the sudden death of Justice Scalia may have changed the outcome. Some believed the plan could have been killed by a 5 to 4 decision of the highest court. From a newspaper article: "The immediate and easily foreseeable impact is staggering. Last week, the Supreme Court issued a stay delaying the implementation of Obama's Clean Power Plan. The stay indicated that a majority of the justices foresee a reasonably high likelihood that they would ultimately strike down Obama's plan, which could jeopardize the Paris climate agreement and leave greenhouse gasses unchecked. Without Scalia on the Court, the odds of this drop to virtually zero. The challenge is set to be decided by a D.C. Circuit panel composed of a majority of Democratic appointees,

which will almost certainly uphold the regulations. If the plan is upheld, it would require a majority of the Court to strike it down. With the Court now tied 4-4, such a ruling now seems nearly impossible."

One last item on the fed level is the \$10 a barrel tax on oil that President Obama wants in the next budget. The money raised from this tax would fund investments in clean transportation that fight climate change. The tax would be phased in over a five year period and help fund high speed rail plus spend \$10 billion to encourage investments that lead to cleaner transportation options. The American Petroleum Institute says the tax would up the price of a gallon of gas by 25 cents. Keep in mind that thousands of products are made from oil and the price of those products would also increase. Of course the current low gasoline prices are why the president decided on this tax. The tax faces tough opposition in Congress with Speaker Paul Ryan calling it dead on arrival. Like many others I would like to see the cost of gasoline stay low.

PRODUCTION FOR THE LATEST FORD MUSTANG HAS BEEN PUSHED UP TWO YEARS

Less than a year after a major revamp, there's yet another new Ford (F) Mustang on the horizon. The latest 2016 Ford Mustang went on sale just last year, starting at around \$24,145.

The next model wasn't scheduled for release until 2022. However, production is being pushed up by two years to 2020, according to a report by a group of accountants and consultants called UHY Hacker Young. It's not that the new Mustang failed to impress; an Edmund's expert review of

the latest model said the "Ford Mustang continues to distinguish itself as a muscle car with genuine crossover appeal." The average consumer rating on the site was four-and-a-half stars.

In a recent Twitter poll by Ford, 38 percent of participants found it "impossible" to choose between the newer Ford Mustang or the classic Mustang.

FORD MUSTANG SELECTED AS A PIECE IN MONOPOLY EMPIRE

The Ford Mustang has been selected to be one of the pieces in Monopoly Empire — an offshoot of the classic Monopoly board game created more than a century ago.

Ford said Friday that Hasbro has selected the Mustang to be the race car in the new edition of Monopoly Empire, which is on sale now.

Monopoly Empire differs from the Classic Monopoly, whereas players buy, sell, and trade their favorite brands to create their own fantasy empire and experience the thrill of owning it all.

"We are thrilled that the Ford Mustang is one of the tokens," Hasbro said in a statement. "Like Monopoly, it's an iconic brand loved by kids and families

and a fun twist on the car token in the Classic Monopoly game."



Monopoly Empire features 22 brands that are relevant to kids and families ranging from Universal Parks & Resorts to Polaroid and Ford. The tokens include the Xbox controller, Ford Mustang, PUMA shoe, Caterpillar excavator, Transformers head and Wilson Tennis Racquet.

Saturday is World Monopoly Day. Fans from around the world will celebrate its 81st birthday of the iconic game at events planned in several cities around the world and through social media.

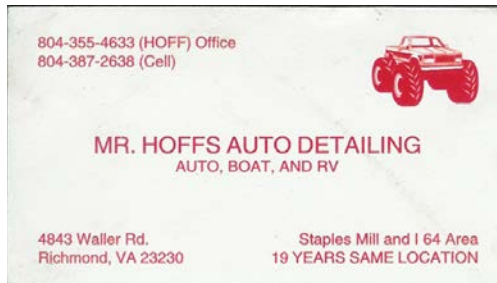
