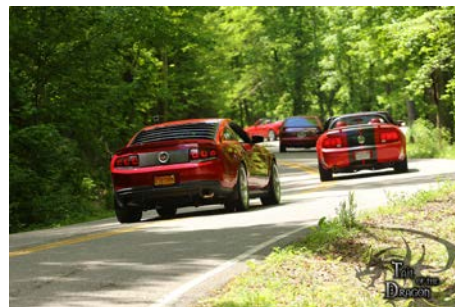

**COMPETING IN A MCA

Well it looks like I missed last month AGAIN!!! This month we will cover the Interior. Most of you already know the basics, so we cover them just for giggles.

**Seats:** Your seats should show normal wear and tear. The Driver's Seat obviously should show more wear and tear than the others. If there are rips and tears they will be deducted. Be sure to clean your seats the best you can. Get into those creases. If you have leather seats be sure to use some sort of Leather Conditioner to keep them looking good. If you have cloth seats you may have to use a shampoo to keep the seats used the most looking good.

**Dashboard:** Be sure to clean all the crevasses in your dashboard. If you like to use a conditioner on your dashboard that's fine. If you have cracks caused by the sun you may want to seriously consider replacing the dashboard. Deductions will be made for cracks. If your dashboard is extremely faded a good conditioner will help bring it back.

**Carpet:** This is pretty cut and dry. Your carpet must be clean. Normal wear and tear is acceptable. Large rips and tears will be deducted. Stains and just good ole dirt will be deducted.

**Headliner:** Your Headliner must be clean also. Any lint, hair, rips and tears will be deducted. Usually all you need to do is just vacuum your headliner, sounds silly I know but it does matter.

**Windows:** Any rock chips (stars) or cracks will be deducted. Be sure to clean your windows the best you can. Streaks will be deducted.

**Door Panels and Door Jams:** Please be sure to clean your door panels. Normal wear and tear is acceptable. **DOOR JAMS & HINGES** are extremely important. Cleaning your door jams are not that hard to do but your door hinges are very hard to clean. This is where people usually mess up because it is very difficult to clean your hinges. I promise you if you do not clean them you will have points deducted.

A good rule of thumb is if you can reach it with you hand it should be clean.

**APRIL 2017 CAR HOBBYIST  
NEWS FROM THE COUNCIL**

On March 13 our governor signed SB 1532 into law. It will be added to Code of Virginia § 46.2-755. Limitations on imposition of motor vehicle license taxes and fees. The addition will read "The motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer qualifies and is licensed as an antique vehicle pursuant to § 46.2-730." This means that localities will no longer be able to charge you an annual

registration/sticker fee for any vehicle registered as an antique. I wish to remind you that no vehicle registered as an antique can be assessed and taxed as personal property (§ 58.1-3503. General classification of tangible personal property). If you are being charged personal property tax on a vehicle registered as an antique you should contact the council for assistance. Over the years we have battled with localities over personal property taxes on antiques. All of the local treasurers and commissioners of the revenue are aware of this law and they will be informed about the new law banning local registration fees on antiques.

HB 2290 was also signed into law by the governor. This law requires each driver education program in the public school system to include instruction concerning traffic stops, including law-enforcement procedures for traffic stops, appropriate actions to be taken by drivers during traffic stops, and appropriate interactions with law-enforcement officers who initiate traffic stops. The bill requires the Board of Education to collaborate with the Department of State Police in implementing the changes to its driver education program.

Now that the General Assembly session is over there is big news from the feds. First there is HR 1315. Legislation (HR 1315) has been introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives to prohibit the sale of E15 (gasoline that is 15% ethanol), capping the amount of ethanol that can be blended into conventional gasoline at 10%. The bill also eliminates the Renewable Fuel Standard's (RFS) mandate that requires 15 billion gallons of corn-based ethanol be blended into the U.S. fuel supply each year. Ethanol, especially in higher concentrations such as E15, can cause damage to older vehicles. There is a link in the council's online newsletter if you wish to contact your representative to ask them to support this bill.

The federal budget proposed by President Trump cuts EPA funding by 31.4% - a cut of \$2.6 billion out of the agency's over \$8 billion budget. Last year it was estimated that EPA regulations cost every person in the US \$540 per year. Last summer - 2016 - 500 major regulations were passed by the Obama administration's EPA. "In other words, each year every person, regardless of age, in the nation is responsible for paying roughly \$540 in regulatory costs. These burdens might take the form of higher prices, fewer jobs, or reduced wages," said American Action Forum's Sam Batkins, director of regulatory policy at the watchdog group. It will be interesting to see what effect this big budget cut has on the EPA if the Trump budget gets through Congress.

Trump is also proposing budget cuts at Transportation and Energy along with other agencies. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration is targeted for a \$250 million reduction in grants that deal with global warming. This goes along with the new EPA head's thoughts. The new head of the Environmental Protection Agency Scott Pruitt says carbon dioxide is not a primary contributor to global warming. "Do you believe that it's been proven that CO2 is the primary control knob for climate?" CNBC anchor Joe Kernen asked Pruitt in a March 9 interview. "No, I think that measuring with precision human activity on the climate is something very challenging to do and there's tremendous disagreement about the degree of impact," Pruitt responded. "So no, I would not agree that it's a primary contributor to the global warming that we see."

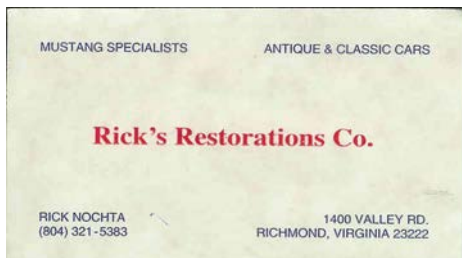
One thing is for certain and that is we will be seeing big changes in how the government deals with the environment, energy and climate change.



You may recall the new CAFE (Corporate Average Fuel Economy) standards were increased under the Obama administration. Automakers will be required to deliver a fleet average of at least 54.5 mpg by 2025. This has led to smaller vehicles, more electric/hybrid vehicles, the Ford F-150 to get an aluminum body and other changes. Automakers have been pushing the Trump administration to reverse the Obama administration decision. The EPA had until April 2018 to decide whether the standards were feasible under a "midterm review," but moved up its decision to a week before President Barack Obama left office in January. Despite the fact that last July, the EPA estimated the fleet would average only 50.8-52.6 mpg in 2025 under the rules because Americans were buying more SUVs and trucks and fewer cars. Environmentalists have threatened to sue if the standards are reduced. Currently some automakers have too many unsold cars in inventory because people buy the SUVs and trucks.

Things are going to be exciting over the next few months.
