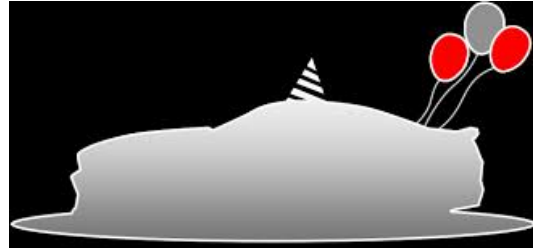

FEBRUARY 2017 CAR HOBBYIST NEWS FROM THE COUNCIL

Yes, I'm still upset because there is no freedom of exhaust choice bill in the General Assembly but let's look at a couple of auto-related matters that did make it as bills:
HB 1627 - State Police to amend its regulations such that a motor vehicle safety inspection shall include an inspection of interior lights to ensure that such lights are in good working order.

HB 1725 - Prohibits any vehicle from driving in the left lane of a highway unless passing another

vehicle or in preparation for a left turn.

HB 2290 - Requires each driver education program in the public school system to include instruction concerning traffic stops

SB 1021 - Provides that the failure to obey a highway sign due to the driver's sleeping or resting in his vehicle on the shoulder of the highway is a prepayable offense.

SB 1184 - Prohibits a person operating a motor vehicle from allowing such vehicle to stand unattended without first stopping the engine, locking the ignition, removing the key from the ignition, and effectively setting the brake.

Those are some really important issues. Interior lights are so important that we need to have them checked during a state inspection. On a four lane highway if someone is driving very slowly in the left lane the police can write a ticket for obstructing traffic. If 1725 becomes law then the police can also write a ticket for driving in the left lane – but you can get out of it – just tell the police you are going to make a left turn soon. If 2290 becomes law then driver ed classes will have to instruct students on how to behave when being pulled over. I'm not sure how a driver who is sleeping is failing to obey a highway sign – perhaps a sign that says don't sleep here. And the best one is you cannot idle your vehicle – 1184 states you must shut off the engine, lock the ignition, remove the key and set the brake plus be wearing clean underwear (okay I make up that last one!). I'm sure you can see these bills are much more important than the State Police telling you that you cannot convert your antique vehicle to dual exhaust and that you must have the same factory exhaust system the vehicle had when new. It is okay to upgrade other stuff such as engine, steering, suspension and brakes. But you have to keep that single exhaust

system and factory muffler. Sure makes sense doesn't it?

There are two bills of interest to we car hobbyists. The first one is SB 1532 Motor vehicle license fees; exemption of antique vehicles. If this bill becomes law it would exempt a motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer that is licensed as an antique vehicle from the imposition of local license fees. The sponsor is Senator Lynwood W. Lewis, Jr. of Accomac, Virginia who is a democrat. The area he represents used to assess and tax antiques as personal property. I'm sure that has something to do with this legislation (I called his office but no one has gotten back to me on the reason for this bill). The second bill is HB 2447 Local licensure of motor vehicles. If this bill becomes law it would eliminate the ability of a locality to assess local license fees for motor vehicles, trailers, and semitrailers. The bill has a delayed effective date of July 1, 2018. The sponsor is Delegate Robert G. Marshall, a republican from Manassas, Virginia. He is known as a conservative and apparently wants to get rid of the additional taxation on vehicles. Vehicles are already taxed as personal property. On top of that localities charge \$20 or \$25 per vehicles as a "registration" fee. It used to be called a sticker tax before most localities did away with the windshield stickers. This is just another tax upon tax.

A few years ago when Chesterfield County did away with stickers the county redid the entire program. The county then assessed a registration fee on every antique vehicle in the county – over 13,000 in total. The result was those who had paid the "one time" fee of \$5 per antique vehicle had to pay another "one time" fee of \$5. In other words the county took over \$65,000 more from the taxpayers. I spoke several times with county officials on this and informed them it was against state law because the state only charged a one time registration fee for antiques then

the localities can only charge a one time fee. The county officials decided to go with the county attorney's opinion that charging a fee twice means only one time in Chesterfield. I hope they put the \$65K to good use.

I also invite you to look through all the introduced legislation. This year there were not as many auto bills as in previous years. We seem to have just about run out of DUI and special license plate bills.

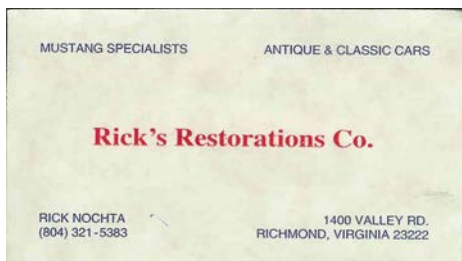
This is 2017 and we will have an election for governor and all 100 house seats. As we all know despite the fact that the Virginia General Assembly is the oldest legislative body in the Western Hemisphere many of the house seats will have no competition. I believe this is one reason why members of the Assembly can get away with ignoring constituents wishes while representing municipalities and the administrations of the state agencies along with of course lobbyists. After representing all of those there is just not enough representation left for the peons (citizens) who vote to keep "our representatives" in office every couple of years.

On the federal front we have a new administration that is just getting started. As a car hobbyist I am hopeful that the EPA and Energy Departments will be more responsive to the citizens and what they really want. Right now we are in wait and see what happens mode. I am willing to give the new administration a chance. Hopefully we will not be disappointed.

In his last couple of days in office former President Obama sent \$500 million to the Green Climate Fund. This doubles the US commitment to the fund to \$1 billion.

Recall that because of the Paris treaty on climate wealthy nations are supposed to give \$100 billion a year to poor nations beginning in 2020. This money will be used to combat climate change. Trump has indicated that he doesn't want to go along with the Paris agreement. In fact this "treaty" was not submitted to the US Senate and has never been voted on. Right after Trump became president all references to "climate change" were removed from the white house website.

Trunk**

Well it looks like I missed last month. I hope everyone had a Merry Christmas, Happy Hanukkah and a Happy New Year!!! This month we will cover the Trunk.

The Trunk is just as important as the Interior and unfortunately gets overlooked too often. The painted areas of the Truck should be cleaned with some kind of quick detailer. The carpeted areas should be vacuumed

and shampooed if needed. Make sure all of the Trunk body panels fit properly and are clean of course. Be sure all of the wires are presentable (no frayed or loose wires). Be sure to concentrate on the hinges this is where most people fall short. The Judges will look at the hinges first.

Many Show Participants like to put displays in the trunk. This is highly discouraged until after you Mustang has been judged.

Well that's it for this month. Next month we will tackle the interior. Remember don't forget those hinges!
