

MCA REPORT



MCA BOD news:

- *MCA Treasurer Maryann Rago stated that the financial report for 2016 was not completed from the accounting firm in time for the meeting.*
- *Committee Chairs submitted their budget requests and Maryann gave a brief overview on those requests. After a discussion a motion was made to accept the 2017 operating budget which was approved.*
- *The Executive Committee has the authority to conduct emergency business that cannot be delayed until the next quarterly scheduled board meeting.*
- *MCA will help Regional Clubs develop and implement policies and procedures that will enable those clubs to request Driving Events. This includes what MCA will provide in the way of support and insurance what the club needs to provide to MCA in order to have an MCA endorsed event. MCA will evaluate the clubs driving event applications and present recommendations to the full MCA Board of Directors for their approval. With this information available should CVMC get RIR approvals to hold an MCA driving event and National show at the track it would take years of planning, hard work and dedication of club members, I can tell you from experience. Back in late 1997 early 1998 members of National*

Capital Region Mustang Club (including me) were talking about having an MCA National show. We started with quarterly meetings forming committees, then by monthly progress meetings. In 2000 MCA said yes to a National show on June 28-30 of 2002 to be called "Stars Stripes and Stangs" MCA National show at the Hyatt hotel, just off Interstate 66 in Fairfax County. Starting in 2001 we were having monthly meetings and Judi and I were in charge of the evening Banquet, I was part of the show Registration/Classification and Technical inspection, show parking for around 300+, and Judging. 5 members and I flew to Kansas City, Kansas to attend, observe and work their MCA National show. By early 2002 various committees I was on were holding meeting every other week or so. Show day arrived too soon and there were a number of CVMC members attending that show where I met Tony Hall. Before 11 AM there was over 300 Mustangs and more coming. Our show flyer indicated a cutoff time of 12 PM. Our parking staff was going nuts trying to find room for all the cars and we finally double parked over 330 cars. We had a great judging team and all cars were judged by 7 PM. The tally room worked into the wee hours and was able to start the awards ceremony around noon so all participants would be able to get an early start home. It was a wonderful experience to see such a large project of 5 years be as successful as this show was and talked about at other MCA shows the following years.

around these show sites fill up very early. If something comes up that you cannot attend you can always cancel your hotel reservations. Registration is open through Motosho. Their website is www.motosho.com.



MAY 2017 CAR HOBBYIST NEWS FROM THE COUNCIL

We are waiting to see what happens with President Trump's budget that will cut funding from the EPA, Energy and Transportation. The EPA regulations are estimated to cost each American over \$540 each year. Trump wants over a 30% cut in EPA funding. And I think that is long overdue. The CAFE or corporate average fuel economy is estimated to prevent 5 million Americans from buying a new car because of the added costs to the price of the vehicles. It's time we got rid of government actions that simply cost us money with no real benefit.

H.R. 1315 - RFS Reform Act of 2017 has been moved to subcommittee on Environment by the House Energy and Commerce. This bill was introduced into Congress at the beginning of March to address RFS or renewable fuel standard. Its purpose is to amend the Clean Air Act to eliminate certain requirements under the renewable fuel program, to prohibit the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency from approving the introduction into commerce of gasoline that contains greater than 10-volume-percent ethanol, and for other purposes. The Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS) is a federal program that requires transportation fuel sold in the United States to contain a minimum volume of renewable fuels. The RFS originated with the Energy Policy Act of 2005 and was expanded and extended by the Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007. And the only renewal fuel is

of course ethanol. This is why the EPA came up with E-15 – to get more ethanol into gasoline. The RFS requires more ethanol each year and most vehicles and especially small engines are unable to use the higher amounts of ethanol.

PredictGov had this to say about the bill: "This bill has a 1% chance of being enacted.

Factors considered:

The overall text of the bill increases its chances of being enacted. Although this bill has a low chance of enactment, there is 1 provision within this bill that the provision-level textual analysis considers likely to be enacted. There are often multiple bills with the same legal provisions within them. The bill is assigned to the House Energy and Commerce committee." We will see what happens to the bill. The bill's sponsor is Bob Goodlatte, representative for Virginia's 6th congressional district.

Since our General Assembly session is over for this year let's take a look at a couple of interesting developments in two other states. Montana has become the 20th state to allow the use of only a rear license plate. But there are restrictions. Below is analysis from SEMA:

"Legislation (H.B. 213) to provide for the issuance of a single rear mounted license plate for certain motor vehicles was signed into law by Governor Steve Bullock. Under the new law "if a person is not able to comply with the requirement that a front license plate be displayed because of the body construction of the motor vehicle, the person may submit to the Highway Patrol an application for a waiver along with a \$25 inspection fee." The law requires that the waiver certificate be carried in the motor vehicle and available upon demand by law enforcement. Vehicle owners are not obligated to apply for the waiver or pay the fee."

That \$25 inspection fee might have something to do with the bill's passage. I wouldn't want the police stopping me just to see that I have a waiver certificate for one plate.

In 2012 the Texas A&M Transportation Institute did a study titled "Front License Plate Market Research: Comparison of Single Versus Dual License Plates." I read through the report and it looks like it was done by police administrators that want two plates on vehicles. There was a paragraph about Virginia: "Lack of front plates has significant impact on the generation of photographic evidence related to fining toll violators. With respect to Virginia's toll violations, 23% could not be pursued due to the lack of license plate data." Due to toll booth monitoring equipment and license plate readers getting one plate legislation done anywhere has very low odds.

In fact a bill was introduced in West Virginia that would have changed the law from one plate to two. It died when the legislature adjourned without taking action. Another bill that died in West Virginia was a bill on exhaust systems. This is from SEMA:

"Legislation (H.B. 2535) that would have made it a criminal offense to disturb the peace with "noise from an exhaust system of any vehicle that is not equipped or constructed to prevent any disturbing or unreasonably loud noise" died when the legislature adjourned for the year. Under the bill, vehicle owners convicted of a violation would have been fined up to \$1,000 per occurrence, confined up to 6 months in jail or both.

Current West Virginia law only allows a muffler originally installed by the manufacturer or an equivalent. The law provides no objective noise measurement standard for exhaust systems that would benefit consumers, industry and police officers charged with enforcing the law. The term


“disturbing or unreasonably loud” is highly subjective and open to wide interpretation.”

This is of course that same problem we have in Virginia and why we tried to get a bill introduced to change the law to allow pre1975 vehicles to use aftermarket exhaust parts. We will try again to get a bill introduced into the 2018 General Assembly. The council is also looking at DMV regulations on titles.

If you buy a vehicle from a non-title state you will need the registration and insurance paperwork for the vehicle from the seller plus a bill of sale. The problem is you cannot just go down to your local customer service center and get a title. You have to mail the original documents to the main DMV in Richmond – and you have to mail them, not deliver in person. I know of two people who have done this and DMV said they didn't get the documents. Since they were sent with tracked mail the people knew DMV lost them. This is stupid – send the only original documents for the title of a vehicle through the mail and even if they get there then DMV loses them. There has to be a better way and we are looking at possible legislation.

I am also tired of DMV putting incorrect information on titles and then charging people to correct the DMV errors. Here is an extreme example – I have seen titles for two replica vehicles (which are assigned a VIN by DMV) where the VIN on the titles did not match the VIN DMV put on the vehicles. If DMV cannot get VINs on titles and vehicles correct when DMV assigns that VIN then there is no wonder why so many titles have incorrect info on them. There should be some way to insure that people who work at DMV get the correct information on every title they handle without an owner having to pay a fee and wait weeks to get the title corrected.

The 2017 Team Shelby East Coast Grand Nationals are going to be

better than ever, and you need to be there with us to enjoy four days of Shelby powered excitement!

The Northeast and the South Atlantic Regions of Team Shelby, in conjunction with Summit Point Raceway and Carlisle Events invite you to join us for an amazing weekend featuring a high performance driving, a cruise/poker run, car shows, parade, movie premier, special guests, food, music, friends, and one of a kind automobiles.



Do you feel the 'need for speed'? Our event starts on June 1st, at Summit Point Raceway in West Virginia, with a High Performance Driving Event. Although hosted by Team Shelby, this event is open to all Ford powered vehicles, and maybe even a few Euro-exotics who want to test themselves against some good old American horsepower...Carroll would certainly approve of that!

If you would like to attend Summit Point, but not track your car, spectators are welcome. After breakfast on Saturday morning at the host hotel, proceed on your own to the Carlisle Ford Nationals, taking place on the fairgrounds. Our hospitality tent, and the Shelby Girls, will be ready to greet you when you arrive. Don't spend too much time enjoying the shade in our tent, with over 3000 cars on the show field, numerous manufactures, vendors, the car carrel, and an enormous swap meet, there is much to see. The 50th Anniversary car will be on stage again, Shelby American will be giving more 'thrill rides', but this time on the Auto-cross track, and the winners of Friday night's car show will be presented with their trophies at noon. As soon as the applause from the award ceremony has died down, Team Shelby will be hosting lunch in our tent for all East Coast Grand National attendees. The afternoon brings the legendary burn-out contest (if you aren't willing to smoke your ties until they literally explode, don't bother entering), and the highly anticipated Ms. Carlisle contest.
