## **FEBRUARY 2018 CAR HOBBYIST NEWS FROM THE COUNCIL**

The big news is that an antique vehicle exhaust bill has been introduced in the General Assembly. After two years of trying to get a bill we have SB 586 sponsored by Senator Bill DeSteph, Jr, a fellow car hobbyist. The bill – if passed into law – will allow vehicles registered as antiques to use aftermarket exhaust parts. Here is the update to the current law:

*“The provisions of this section shall not apply to (i) any antique motor vehicle ~~manufactured prior to 1950~~, provided that the engine is comparable to that designed as standard factory equipment for use on that particular vehicle, and the exhaust system is in good working order, or (ii) converted electric vehicles.”*

There have been no problems since the law was changed a couple of years ago to allow pre-1950 vehicles exhaust freedom. There are simply no OEM or equivalent parts for many antiques vehicles.

Senator DeSteph spoke with the head of the State Police before introducing the bill. When council reps met with the State Police in November 2016 they were against any change in the exhaust law. Apparently there has thankfully been some movement.

SB 586 was introduced on January 10 and a week later approved 11 to 1 by the Senate Transportation

Committee. Less than a week after that approval the entire Senate passed the bill by 37 to 2. The bill will now move on to the House where it will be assigned to a subcommittee of the House Transportation Committee. It will have to pass the subcommittee, then the committee, then go on to be voted on by the House. If the bill passes the House, without any changes, then it can go to the governor for approval. Keep in mind the governor is a car hobbyist who owns a 1971 Corvette and has restored a 1953 Oldsmobile. I am very hopeful this will become law.

Let's take a look at some of the bills in the Assembly of interest to car hobbyists. You can go to the Virginia Association of Car Councils website where all the bills of interest are listed at <http://vaacc.org/legis1.html>

This is being written during the third week of January for publication so nearly all the bills below are currently in committee with only a couple being passed by committee. There are a couple of bills to make all passengers in the rear seat of a vehicle wear seatbelts. Current law allows those 18 and over to decide to wear belts while riding in the back seat.

As you know the State Police changed the location of inspection stickers beginning the first of the year. There are a couple of bills to put that change into the Code of Virginia.

There are a couple of speed limit bills that would change some roads from 55 to 60 mph limit. And there is a bill to make 45 mph the minimum speed on interstates and some other limited access roads.

There are several bills that would prevent you from using your cell phone while driving unless it is a hands-free device. Current law bans only texting while driving. A couple of bills would make it an offense to drive with an animal in your lap.

*There are a couple of bills that would alter the definition of motor vehicle dealer to get rid of dealer licenses for people who are selling fewer than five vehicles a year.*

*There is a bill to increase inspection fees from \$12 to \$15 for motorcycles and from \$16 to \$25 for vehicles less than 26,000 pounds which would be personal use cars and trucks.*

*A bill would allow strip searches of people in custodial arrest for a traffic violation if an officer has reasonable cause to believe that person is concealing a controlled substance.*

*There are a couple of bills to allow military surplus off road vehicles to be registered as antiques (if they are 25+). These are vehicles that the US military has sold to civilians.*

*One bill would allow you to have certain non-required, unapproved, or unpermitted lighting devices on your vehicle uncovered. Current law states they must be covered when on highways.*

*One bill would allow the sale of ethanol-free gasoline in parts of Hopewell that border Prince George County on the west side.*

*A bill would allow electric vehicle charging stations on public property. These would be fee based – you have to pay to use them.*

*Special license plates have returned. Here is a list of them: ROCKY MOUNTAIN ELK FOUNDATION, STOP GUN VIOLENCE, BELIEVING IN THE FUTURE OF AGRICULTURE SINCE 1927 (not sure how to fit all that on a plate), E PLURIBUS UNUM, I SUPPORT WOMEN VETERANS, FIRST IN WINE, I HAVE A DREAM, KEEPING THE LIGHTS ON, NATIONAL WILD TURKEY FEDERATION, VIRGINIA REALTORS,*

**ALZHEIMER'S ASSOCIATION, FRIENDS OF THE BLUE RIDGE PARKWAY.**

*There are some bills to set towing and recovery fees. Plus one bill that would put drive-in movie theaters on highway signs as an attraction and a bill to stop DMV from charging extra for services just because you are at the DMV in person instead of mailing or using the internet for your registration, driver's license renewal or ID card.*

*Most bills fail in the Assembly. You can go to the VAACC site listed above where there are links to each bill so you can check the status and get full information on that piece of legislation.*
