MCA REPORT

Mustang Club of America (MCA) news:

- Did everyone review the nominations for MCA's corporate Board of Directors in the September issue of Mustang Times? Voting was easy once I understood the first time process. I reviewed the bios, some I knew, and voted for whom I thought was best suited to keep our club advancing into the future. This was your right and privilege and I hope every MCA club member voted, on line as I did, and submitted their vote before the absolute deadline of September 30, 2019.

Some additional information from May 11th Board of Directors meeting:

- There were no nominations for the Hall of Fame award this year. An article will be written in the Mustang Times concerning this.
- Another Assistant National Head Judge position will be established starting in 2020. Other proposed changes are the timing of the judging meeting and some specialty classes.

The MCA Grand National in Fredericksburg had 460 gorgeous Mustangs like the custom build carbon fiber body \$600K '65 Fastback with 380 cars judged. They came from the West Coast, Central, East Coasts and Canada. CVMC did very well bringing home 9 Gold and 1 Bronze awards. All CVMC members showing their Mustangs earned awards. Besides judging I saw or heard from inside the Center Nickie and Brian Armstrong, Janet and Mark Chase, Sharon Hazelgrove and sons Justin and Mark, Ron Martin, Larry Money Penny and Betty Wiseman attending the show. I hope I didn't miss anyone as there were thousands of visitors viewing all the Mustangs.

There was a fantastic turn out of CVMC members who volunteered to judge or work the show. They were: David and Laurie Deusebio, Tony Hall, Michelle and Bernie Jordon, Rob Lyles, Kathy McWilliams, Mike Peyton and me.

Attending the Judges meeting were Michelle and Bernie Jordon, Dave and Laurie Deusebio, Tony Hall who was presented his Judging Gold Card and me

The following CVMC members received awards: Laurie Deusebio, Gold for her driven 2018 Mustang coupe; Judi Dickey, Gold for her Concours Driven 1967 Mustang coupe; Tony Hall, Gold for his driven 2006 Mustang GT coupe; Sharon Hazelgrove, Gold for her trailered 1970 Mustang Mach 1, and another Gold, for her driven 2018 Shelby GT350; Michele Jordon, Gold for her driven 2008 GT Mustang Coupe; Joan McGrath, Bronze for her trailered 1966 Mustang Convertible; Robin Reese, Gold for her driven 2003 GT Mustang; and Rusty Wiseman Gold, for his driven 2009 Mustang Bullitt.

Judi's 1967 Mustang had earned 18 Concours Driven (Blue) points toward her Grill Medallion award that required 20 points in the Concours Driven category. Most of those points were earned before the 1997 cutoff date. I spent well over 50 hours of preparation on her Mustang for the Grand National in Fredericksburg. The Gold award earned another 3 points, so we now have the required points, but not the proof before the cutoff date. I have talked with the award committee and they will accept the month and date our name appeared in the "Mustang Times" magazine show statistics or the dated judging sheet or picture of the dated awards. So my research begins.

Mike Peyton and I spent many hours creating the Fall show program booklets. We want to thank CVMC members for providing us with show business cards, sponsors and vendor ads materials. This year the program booklets were included in the show goodie bags.

September's issue of Mustang Times has an excellent, informative article on how to become a Gold Card Judge on page 8, a superb life story with several pictures of Lee Iacocca pages 26 to 31. Belgium MCA member Adelbert Engler shipped his S550 Mustang to America for the "55 Years of Mustang" celebration and the

opening of the Mustang Owner's Museum, a great story, on pages 38 to 40.

OCTOBER 2019 Car Hobbyist News From the Council

President Trump has revoked California's authority to set auto emissions standards. You may recall years ago automakers built 49-state emissions vehicles and also built vehicles just for California that had its own standards that were higher than the federal government standards for emissions and mileage. It didn't take automakers long to figure out it was easier to just build one vehicle that would satisfy both federal and California standards. The problem was that everyone – including those in 49 states – were paying more for vehicles that met California standards. Federal authorities say an agreement California reached with major automakers to produce more fuel-efficient cars violate anti-trust laws.

From Yahoo! News: "The Trump Administration is revoking California's Federal Waiver on emissions in order to produce far less expensive cars for the consumer, while at the same time making the cars substantially SAFER," Trump tweeted.

The administration argues that higher standards lead to higher costs for consumers, depressing

the new car market and resulting in more old and unsafe vehicles on the roads.

Trump, who made the announcement during a trip to California, added: "There will be very little difference in emissions between the California Standard and the new U.S. Standard, but the cars will be far safer and much less expensive.

"Many more cars will be produced under the new and uniform standard, meaning significantly more JOBS, JOBS, JOBS! Automakers should seize this opportunity because without this alternative to California, you will be out of business."

Trump made the announcement to revoke California from setting its own standards on September 18 just days before a major UN summit on averting climate change disaster. It also brings up the topic of state's rights. The EPA does have the authority to set emissions and fuel economy standards for the entire country.

The average price of a new vehicle is now just below \$40,000 and it is climbing. Anything to make vehicles less costly I think is a good move. You may have also noticed that both new and used vehicles are not selling. Dealers are trying different techniques to sell vehicles such as contacting people after their vehicles are serviced at a dealership to try to entice people to trade their old vehicles in for new vehicles. In fact one person I know called a dealership about a used truck and during the next week that dealership called him four times in an effort to get him to buy the truck. Apparently houses are selling but not vehicles.

And if you've looked at antique vehicle prices you might get sticker shock. I have no trouble finding vehicles for sale at double high book price and I've even found ones for triple high book. Keep in mind that the highest book price is usually for vehicles offered for sale by dealers who can finance a purchase and may give a 30-day warranty. In Virginia all private sales of vehicles are no warranty/as is by state law.

There are over 14,000 vehicles for sale in the collector car category on eBay Motors and over the last 90 days about 13,000 vehicles have sold. Most vehicles run for one week so using some simple math that means about 1% of vehicles sell on eBay. Of course this doesn't

account for vehicles that run multiple times and some other variables. Still this hasn't stopped people from listing vehicles for sale at unreal prices. I know of one vehicle that has been on eBay for over two years for sale with a buy it now of \$29,500. My estimate of the vehicle's value and what it would actually sell for is about half that price. And I've seen vehicles for sale for months on Craigslist. CL a few months ago started charging \$5 to run a vehicle for sale for 30 days. I heard this was to stop fraud but it seems to have cut down on some of the older vehicles being posted for sale. Facebook Marketplace is another site where vehicles are listed for sale. The vehicles are all lumped together – motorcycles, trucks, big trucks, cars, SUV's and even jet skis are all in the same category called "vehicles" and there are plenty of dealer ads. In fact the dealer ads outnumber the private party ads. Unlike CL, on Facebook Marketplace you cannot just select for sale by owner only.
