On Day One I crossed into the State of Tennessee I traveled south on I-81 and then westward on I-40 to Jackson, Tennessee for the night.

On Day Two, I left early and headed westward on I-40. My next post was a Photo of me crossing the Mississippi River into the State of Arkansas. Luckily the worst of the storm didn't last very long. I made it to Gallup safe and sound.

On Day Five, it's a relatively short trip to Albuquerque and a well-deserved rest.

On Day Six, it was time to clean up the Mustang for the MCA National. The inside of my rims was filthy from brake dust. I really didn't want to have to jack up my Mustang and pull the rims to clean them. Luckily, I found a wheel cleaner at Auto Zone that did a fantastic job. Just spray it in the inside of the rims really good and then hit with a high-pressure hose and you have really clean rims and I didn't have to take them off to clean them. Excellent!

On Friday it was check-in time at the National and to do the final touches to the Mustang and wait for the judges to arrive. I saw a few people I knew from past Nationals, and I met a couple from Floyd County, Virginia. They drove both of their Mustangs to the show. There were people from North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia and I think I saw someone from Florida. There were Mustangs from Oklahoma, Texas, Kansas, Arkansas, New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada, California, Washington, Montana, Colorado, Nebraska, to mention a few. While I was waiting for the Judges I was interviewed for a Podcast called "Your Mustang Story" Google it, you'll find it. The judges showed up that afternoon which was great because now I don't have to unload my trunk anymore (smile).

On Saturday, it was time to meet people and take pictures until the Judges Meeting. I helped on Saturday afternoon. Luckily there weren't very many, so we finished up rather early. The Rio Grande Mustang Club said they had 234 Mustangs from 26 States at the National, held at the Balloon Festival Park. It was a very good show and I'm glad I went. Everyone I met out west was as nice as they could be.

On Sunday it was Award's time. I was very anxious to get it over with so I could get back to Yukon, Oklahoma for the night and see what Garth was up to. My Mustang did well, she placed Gold in her class. I have got to praise my 2006 Mustang GT, except for a slight vibration at 75 to 80 she did fantastic on the trip. She also got excellent gas mileage, 26 to 29 MPG with 127,000+ miles on odometer.

On Monday I had to deal with rain all the way to Arkansas and I made it almost to Nashville and Tuesday was the final leg of the trip back home.

I really did have a great time. I heard a rumor about a National in Colorado! HmMMMM.

As of June 14 check, down to Florida, coach, is \$400.00, back up, coach, is \$320.00 for a total round trip of \$720.00. Other train upper rooms are more expensive.

A Personal note:

April's "Mustang Times" magazine has Don Farr's Remembering Tom Corcoran page 6. I met Tom Corcoran many years ago. Tom flew up to Washington, D.C. in 1988 from Florida to photograph Judi's 1967 Mustang along with other National Capital Regional Mustang Club (NCRMC) Mustangs for a few picture's and Mustang stories to be published in the 1988 and 1989 issues of Mustang Monthly. Judi's car was supposed to be for the front cover, however it really rained that Saturday and Tom did not have the correct color film with him in those days. This was in 1988 and the picture turned out to be Blue, but the actual Mustang color is Clear Water Aqua. If you look carefully at the picture you will see the rain bubbles on the hood. Anyway, Judi's story was published in January 1989 issue on pages 48 & 49 along with NCRMC Rich Porter's 1965 Yellow Mustang GT convertible, pages 46 & 47. On April 17, 1994 in Charlotte, N.C., Tom and I met again for MCA's 30th Mustang Anniversary. Tom had just published and gave me an autograph copy of "Muscle Car Color History Mustang 64 ½ - 68" (now out of print) book containing several colored pictures of Judi's 1967 Mustang along with autographed colored prints submitted to the book publisher. Tom also listed many NCRMC members including myself.



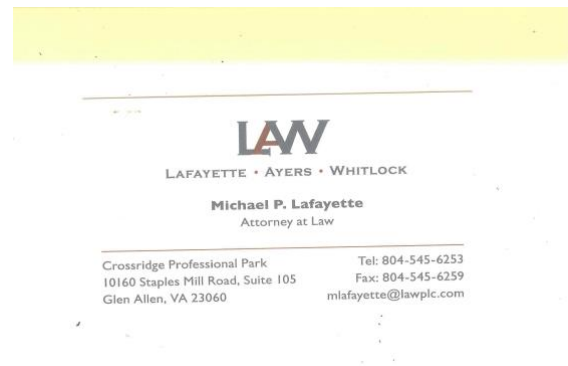
