

JULY 11TH MINUTES

The July meeting of the CVMC was called to order on July 11, 1990 at 7:30 p.m. at Richmond Ford by Monte Evans, President.

New members and visitors Barbara Hobgood, Wayne Thurston, Larry Boyd, and another gentleman who was busy filling out a membership form and didn't give us his name were recognized.

Monte announced that Mark Saxon, owner of Advanced Mobile Glass would be our speaker for tonight and that they will be a new Club sponsor. The video "25 Years of Racing Mustangs" will also be shown this evening.

Monte informed us it will be necessary to postpone the display of Mustangs at Page Ford on July 28th because of a conflict of scheduling. After a discussion of dates it was decided August 11th would be a good time since we will have another meeting before then.

The sponsor's of the Virginia Car Lovers Show have been in touch with Monte and they are planning to have a party in which the Club will be invited. Also, they will be sending questionnaires to be completed regarding the show in June and the way it was

handled. They are asking that we please be candid in our replies.

The new Hotline, 730-7756 is continuing to be a very big success.

Monte brought to our attention the new items in the newsletter, "Spotlight on Members" which is very interesting and thanked Mike and Carolyn for another good idea and a job well done.

The Adopt-A-Highway program package has been received and does involve lots of rules. If we decide to pursue it, a speaker will come to address us. We will be responsible for cleaning up trash in approximately a 2 mile stretch 2 to 4 times a year. We will pick up the trash and have the bags on the side of the road. We will be able to choose the area we want to be designated as ours. FROM THE EDITOR: *The following article was received from Brad Flippen in an effort to keep us informed of the progress made in his suit against Nationwide Insurance.*

STATED VALUE SUIT SETTLED

Some of you may have heard of the Mustanger in Centreville, VA who filed suit against Nationwide. Brad Flippen of the National Capital Region Mustang Club, had filed suit in Fairfax County against Nationwide because they refused to pay the full stated amount of \$3,000 when his 1965 Mustang coupe was totaled on July 29, 1989.

Their position was the wording in their stated amount policy endorsement said they would pay the lesser of the stated amount or the actual cash value of the car, whichever was less. Their final position was stated by the claim adjuster's supervisor: "I will not pay the \$3,000 unless directed to do so by my superiors or a judge".

Details of the case were printed in a flyer, 20,000 copies of which he distributed to clubs and shows across the United States.

Good news. Nationwide agreed to settle out of court for the full \$3,000 stated amount of his policy. Brad picked up his check from his lawyer on June 25th. Unfortunately, the suit was not settled based on its legal merits, but rather Nationwide decided it was easier than going to court again. As you will remember, Brad was initially offered \$900.

The claim adjuster's moral of the story for Mustangers is: read your policy carefully.

If you have a stated amount policy, realize that in most states they still pay the Actual Cash Value and do not automatically pay the stated amount.

FORD MOTORSPORT NATIONALS

Do you ever get tired of driving miles to a car show to find out only a small number of Fords entered? If you're a Ford lover, you'll feel as if you died and went to heaven at the Ford Motorsport Nationals. This year the event was held in Reading, PA. This event is well worth the five hour drive. This two day event involves almost continuous drag racing, a car show, vendor and manufacturers areas. A little something for everyone.

There were classic and late model Mustangs everywhere. All late model owners should be proud of their cars. There were street late models turning 12's and 13's on the quarter mile. Several of those ponies out ran some of their older ancestors. In the car show area, it was the late models with a strong showing. The owners of these cars had torn apart and detailed almost every engine part imaginable. A lot of the late models had custom paint as well as re-done interiors.

As usual, there was a good showing of classic Mustangs, Shelbys, Bosses, and Cobras. Many of these cars were highly modified and some were stock. All in all, I would say there were about 200 cars in the show by Sunday afternoon, even a Mustang station wagon.

The drag racing was exciting with the large number of fast pro-stock cars that were entered. The jet cars and Ford Probes and Bird funny cars were awesome to watch scream down the track.

This event was certainly for Ford lovers. Nothing got through the participation gate without a Ford engine. Even the spectator parking lot was filled with fine Fords.
