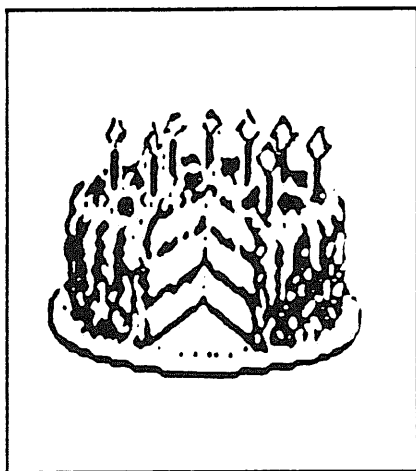

RICK'S TIPS

REPRODUCTION FENDER UPDATES

In the last couple of months, I have purchased approximately 10 reproduction front fenders. Of the ten, four did not fit. The problem area is the headlight assembly matching the fender edges.

Keep in mind that no headlight assembly matches exactly, however, if the lines are too far off, there is no need to use the fender.

One sure way to stay out of trouble is to mount the headlight assembly on the fender before installing the fender. Do this before painting, drilling or mounting the fender. If a person paints or drills or scratches the fender it will be harder to take it back.

One last note, the fenders do not fit as close to the hood as the Ford's do and as usual some of the holes for the bolts need to be slotted because they are off sometime.

MAY 2ND MINUTES

The May meeting of the CVMC was called to order on May 2, 1990 at 7:30 p.m. at Richmond Ford by Monte Evans, President.

We welcomed all visitors, and Andy Parks, a new member was welcomed.

Monte informed us that Jack Neely from the Virginia Car Lovers Show would speak for a few minutes on that show. Also, he told us there is a possibility Ford Motorsports could play a part in the Universal Ford Show with contributions of merchandise as well as the possibility of a Nascar race car being there. Lots of help will be needed! Universal Ford will be selling apparel such as hats and jackets. There will be space allocated for approximately 100 cars and vendor spaces. Universal will handle all advertising and the show will be included in all TV ads.

The Petersburg Show will be Saturday, May 5th. Carroll Lipscombe will talk to us about judging. We are hoping for in excess of 100 cars. The show is on "rain or shine". We need volunteers for judging.

Some of the shows that are coming up are the Tri-City Cruisers Show and Shine, Petersburg Airport August 11th, 9 a.m. - 5 p.m.; Jerry's Ford Super All Ford Meet, 6510 Little River Tnpk., Annandale, May 20th; Virginia Car Lovers Show, State Fairgrounds, Richmond, June 2-3; All Ford Day, Early V8 Ford Club, Ingleside Plantation, Mechanicsville, May 26th; Varina Ruritan Show, October 20th; Gloucester May Car & Craft Show, May 26th, as well as another show on October 20th.

Monte and all club members agreed that Carolyn Timms (and Mike) should be commended for the great job that was done on the May issue of "The Galloping Gazette".

It was agreed, we all like the "new look".

Mr. Neely spoke to us about the Virginia Car Lovers Show. The club will operate a membership booth at the show. There will be 2 classes for Mustangs. Volunteers are needed to help put on the show; will need about 50 people.

Monte talked about the new phone line for the club. The number is 730-7756. Quite a few calls are coming in, it is a big success. Calls regarding cars for sale are a 1966 Silver Convertible, \$8,500; 1970 Fastback; Boss 302 camshaft, \$3,500; also there was a call from someone owning a 1967 Shelby GT 500 requesting technical advice.

Mr. Clyde P. Christian a teacher from Armstrong High School reminded us about their 3rd annual parade/march against crime on May 12th. Some members will attend and anyone who is interested should contact Carroll Lipscombe. Parade units will assemble at Chimborazo Park at 11 a.m. for the 12:00 march.

The club cruise is scheduled for Saturday night May 5th at Bill's on the Boulevard after the show at Petersburg Ford.

The members present all agreed that a "Bowling Outing" would be a fun thing and a date and place will be announced soon. Kings Dominion was also mentioned as a good family fun trip.

One of the ideas to come out of the Board of Directors meeting was the possibility of the club participating in the "Adopt a Highway" program. Monte will check into this and a report will be in the newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: Cheryl Kean reported that we had a beginning balance of \$1,602.37 and after payment of bills our present

balance is \$1,024.62.

Car Show Chairman: Kenny Fischer told us we will need lots of volunteers for the Petersburg Show as well as the Universal Ford Show, both for judging and scoring. He told us about a video tape "The 25 Years of Mustang" which he had received, but could not play because we didn't have a machine and he will try to make arrangements for a machine.

Club Merchandise: Nellie Fischer has club t-shirts, hats, pins, etc. for sale as well as 6 more crystal cars.

Refreshment Chairman: Barbara Evans had various drinks 50 cents each. Door prizes included a lounge chair, tool box, certificate for Braves tickets. New member got 3 free raffle tickets.

Carolyn Timms suggested the idea of a "Spotlight on Members" column for the newsletter each issue and passed out forms to each member requesting that they fill them out and return them to her.

Membership Chairman: Kevin Kean announced we currently have 54 members. Some members still need to renew. He also said he had membership cards for people who had paid and hadn't picked up their cards. He said the club members should show their appreciation by giving Nellie a hand for doing such a great job on the Universal Ford Car show flyers. Andy Parks our new member, has a '66 Coupe.

Kevin would appreciate any suggestions on how to pick up new members. Don't forget, everyone is invited to go to Friendly's after the meeting.

Nascar: Donna Seay has information regarding the Nascar miniature cars, there are Ford cars available for Bill Elliott, Davey Allison, Mark Martin, Neil Bonnett, and Morgan Shepherd. The series

Goody's Headache Powders, a sponsor for Richard Petty, sent us a Petty poster and samples of their product. Also, she had books and Rusty Wallace stickers. These things were donated to the raffle.

The tickets for the September Nascar race go on sale at break time. First come, first serve!

Al Azzarone told us Jim Haskell from the Mustang Club of America had contacted him and asked what assistance MCA could give our club. He handed out blank forms to fill in if anyone is interested in participating in the research program "In Search of Mustangs".

Picnics: Nellie Fischer said since so many of our members usually attend All Ford Day, it would be a good idea to incorporate that show and a picnic. A show of hands indicated about 20 members are interested. Another idea for an outing; Kevin Kean mentioned making his boat available for a river outing.

Carroll Lipscombe said he wants judges by 8:30 Saturday, he would talk on judging after break.

Monte told us after the break about something which was brought up at the Board of Directors and Chairpersons meeting which was the possibility that the club needs to be friendlier as a group. Maybe we need to strive to be nicer and welcome newcomers more openly. It is true membership has its privileges and that's okay, but what binds all of us together is our interest in the Mustang.

It was announced there are 9 Nascar tickets left.

One last thing on the Petersburg Show, Carroll Lipscombe says

the judging will be casual, cleanliness and condition will be stressed. Anyone who is planning to work, a group will meet at Shoney's in Chester at 7:30. There will be between 20 and 25 classes, oldest car and longest distance will be included.

Mike Timms is still checking into a possible rally for the club.

It was stated by Kenny that members traveling to All Ford Day as a group should meet at Laburnum Ave. and Mechanicsville Pike at the Family Dollar Store parking lot around 8:30 in order to leave around 9:00.

A member mentioned that one of our sponsors, Ray Broyhill Ford, was less than pleasant about giving club discounts. Carroll said he will check into this for us.

June 23rd will be proposed to Richmond Ford for our display at their dealership.

Mike Timms asked about a club discount at Universal Ford and Carroll will check with the parts manager on this also.

Raffle drawing: Andy, our new member won and took the lounge chair, Monte won the Braves tickets, Mike, one of our old members, threw his tickets away because he didn't win again; Kenny took the Richard Petty poster for a dart board; Brenda Jones won the tool box and a flashlight was the surprise; Al Azzarone won the books.

**BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING
APRIL 29, 1990**

The second board meeting was called to order by Monte Evans at 7:00 pm. Those in attendance were: Monte & Judy Evans, Kenny & Nellie Fischer, Bonnie Fischer, Kevin & Cheryl Kean, Terry Wagner, Butch Williamson and Donna Seay, Al Azzarone, Sonny Coble, Carl & Barbara Evans, Carroll Lipscombe, Donnie Herndon, and Mike & Carolyn Timms.

Monte discussed the Universal Ford car show. Universal Ford has really accepted the car show and they are enthusiastic about it. Monte made the proposal to them that the Club provide trophies, dash plaques, judging, registration, mailing, event insurance etc. Universal will provide vendor parking (which will be limited), advertisements, and the lot will be available to us the night before after 5:00 p.m. When the topic of trash cans came up, Universal said that Ford Motorsports may want to provide them as well as the possibility of having a Nascar show car on the lot. They also want to have a Ford Motorsports apparel stand. Monte also asked them if they would sponsor the Best In Show trophy and they agreed. They also stated they wanted this to be a long-term partnership with our Club.

Monte opened the topic to discussion among the members.

Concession was bought up and it was decided that we would sell no food and approach a local Boy Scout troop to sell drinks.

Judging - a different sheet will be needed, not MCA but more detailed than the Petersburg Ford judging sheet.

Advertising - Monte will ask Holly if she is still interested in doing this task, and it was decided that we need to act this week because it takes a good 4 weeks for notification to the magazines.

Monte also stated that we have no legal contract for the show just a gentlemen's agreement. Everyone agreed that that was fine.

Monte will ask them about a live radio broadcast.

September 15, 1990 from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. is the date and time of the show and Nellie is working on a flyer and will have it ready this week. Everyone voted

to change the name from the Classic Car Cavalcade to CVMC presents our 6th annual Mustang and Ford Show, September 15th, sponsored by Universal Ford.

Monte asked everyone if they saw the ad in the local newspaper this weekend regarding our new phone number. It was under Auto Services/Announcements. The ad will run in the Trading Post and Style Weekly this week.

The June 2 & 3 car show at the fairgrounds was discussed. They need 6 security people, parking assistants, and assistance in vendor parking. We get a booth to advertise our Club if we help. We have to request a booth, because it is not given automatically. Monte said he would take care of this. We will also get 2 free passes for people working the booth as well as an ad in the Auto Trader for our show at Universal Ford for working this weekend. Everyone said they would help.

Monte asked Carroll if he had any response on the "We Care" parade, or the Dorey Park show and Carroll said he had not heard from anyone.

A discussion was bought up about the "Adopt A Highway" for the state. This is something that is done twice a year. Monte will investigate further and bring it up at the meeting on Wednesday.

Committee Chairpersons and Directors speak out:

Sonny Coble - Prospective members attending the monthly meetings and did not like them. They don't know anyone and feel left out. We need to make them feel more welcomed. We should walk around and say hello. New members should be recognized at the beginning of each meeting.

Barbara Evans - Wanted to know if we would be interested in purchasing items from the Motorsports catalog for door prizes from June - December. Most items are expensive although they do have some reasonable priced items. Barbara suggested 4 mugs at \$9.00, Ford Motorsports Sweatshirt \$19.95, Hat with the same logo as the sweatshirt \$9.95, Sport Tote Bag \$12.95, Ford V8 Owners Manual \$15.00, and for December a Clock \$27.00. Everyone agreed.

Carroll Lipscombe - Nothing in particular. Carroll stated we had an extra good bunch of people in the Club.

Mike Timms - New members was bought up again and Mike suggested that Kevin contact these members for their comments on the meeting. Monte suggested we give them a free raffle ticket. 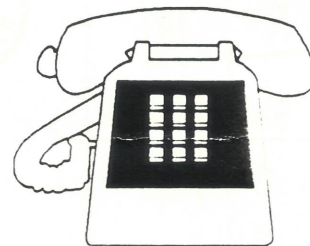
