

The April 4, 1990 meeting of the CVMC was called to order at Richmond Ford at 7:30 p.m. by president, Monte Evans.

We have a new member, Delbert Horn with a '65 Convertible.

Monte discussed the Jamestown cruise in which 15 cars participated and that we had a car show on the ferry. Monte appreciated everyone who participated.

We had 9 cars at the St. Patrick's Day Parade. Nellie pulled a little red wagon with a leprechaun on board, and we received favorable comments regarding our participation.

The Scavenger Hunt produced a quality turn-out. Carl and Barbara Evans were the winners. Monte thanked Mike and Carolyn Timms for putting on this event.

The Petersburg show is scheduled for May 5th. Judges should get there as early as possible. Also, Carroll can use more judges, so if you can please sign up.

The Universal Ford show is set for September 15th. Monte stated he had a meeting scheduled to meet with Universal to iron out the details. No further information is available now.

The Board of Directors meeting which is scheduled for

Saturday, April 28th has been moved to Sunday the 29th at 6 p.m. at Monte's house.

The Auto Trader Show on June 2 & 3, 1990 needs volunteers - Monte raised the question do we want to donate our time as a Club? The members voted they would help with parking and security as needed.

Treasurer's Report: Cheryl Kean stated she had not received the statement for March, but her balance is \$1,602.37.

Car Show Chairman: Kenny Fischer said he will be calling a show meeting together and get committees together for the Universal car show. We need volunteer judges and scorers for the Petersburg car show.

Club Merchandise: Nellie Fischer said she has club t-shirts, hats, medallions, key chains, etc. available.

Membership Chairman: Kevin Kean said we now have 46 members up from 34. Urged everyone who has not renewed to do so. Kevin said he was going to send out letters to past members to rekindle some interest in becoming members again. Kevin also reminded everyone to come out to Friendly's after the meeting.

Donna Seay: Has ideas on how to increase membership - a letter with an application on the back, given to Kevin to update. Donna suggested that when we go to auto parts stores to put these letters on the counters. Another suggestion Donna had was to prepare a package to give to all Ford dealerships so that when they sold a Mustang the buyer

would receive this package with a 6 month temporary membership. Donna also had the idea that when new members come to the club meetings and sign up that we get his address and phone number so that we can follow-up, because a lot of times new members come to one meeting and we never see them again.

NASCAR: Donna Seay passed around a petition for everyone to sign to stop politicians from banning cigarette industries from sponsoring sports events like Nascar racing.

Donna said that since we all whined over Darrell Waltrip winning the Most Popular Driver in '89 over Bill Elliott, she passed around sheets to vote for Bill in '90.

Donna also showed us some racing memorabilia - Bill Elliott and Dale Earnhardt small cars with stands and cards for \$5.00 each.

She said the only Fords available now other than Bill's are Davey Allison, Mark Martin, Neil Bonnett and Morgan Shepherd. The address for ordering the cars is available through Donna.

Donna said there is a possibility that she may be able to get a Grand National race car driver to address the Club at a meeting. She would not give

details in the event it fell through.

Donna wanted to know if the Club wanted her to continue with the spotlight on Nascar drivers in our newsletter and everyone said yes.

Donna also wanted to know how everyone felt about spotlighting a Club member each month in the newsletter - everyone thought it was a good idea.

Monte said we have not yet received letter regarding our tickets for the race in September. Money for the tickets are due to RIR on April 27th. Tickets will be on sale at the next meeting - FIRST COME FIRST SERVE.

Program Speakers: Donnie Herndon said the speaker for the evening never showed up so Monte suggested Donnie do the Mustangee quiz after break with the members participating.

Publicity/Publications: Holly asked Kevin if the newsletter and gone out - Kevin responded that they had.

Refreshments Chairman: Barbara Evans said the basket on the table up front had some tickets with all the other eggs filled with candy and urged everyone to get one - they were free.

Barbara stated that she had Coke, Pepsi, Sprite and Dr. Pepper available.


DO YOU JUST BELONG?
