RICK'S TIPS

RICK'S BELIEVE IT OR NOT

The following happened to me. Having decided to try to find a very very rare carburetor (only 2 dozen have shown up out of a possible 50 believed total production), an ad in Hemmings was placed. I received a couple of calls, but the last call was really an interesting one.

David Aldridge called me concerning the carburetor I had advertised for. His price on the carbs was very very low. I was tickled to death. Three months of ads and I had located a pair of them. I asked if he had any other parts. He stated he had purchased a deceased Ford executive's collection. The Ford executive whose estate was valued at \$26 million collected Fords and Corvettes. Mr. David Aldridge stated he wanted the Corvettes and wished to dispose of all the Ford parts.

I asked him what he had. He stated most parts, approximately 90% were New Old Stock with concentration placed on Boss 302 and Boss 429. The used pieces were Ford experimental parts developed for racing that the deceased Ford executive had picked up and stored. The quantity of parts were a hundred or so boxes of New Old Stock with 20 to 30 experimental racing pieces. I was ecstatic. David Aldridge stated he wished to sell all pieces and would let the whole package go very cheaply to sell the parts. He did not care what they were worth because he was given the parts free with purchasing the Ford executive's cars.

I decided to ask what cars he was selling and were any Ford products. Mr. Aldridge stated that the only 2 Ford cars he had for sale were a Boss 429 and a 1957 T-Bird. Both cars were original paint and unrestored, and both had less than 45,000 miles. Mr. Aldridge stated that he had paid \$4,000 for both cars and would like to make \$2,000 profit on the two cars.
