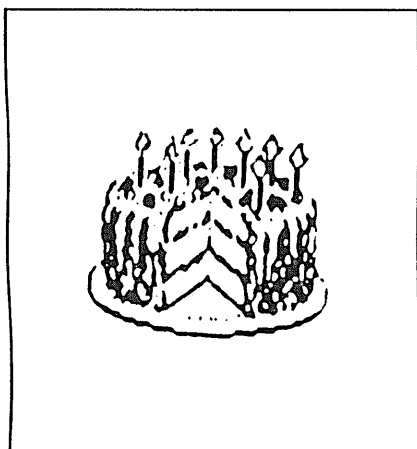

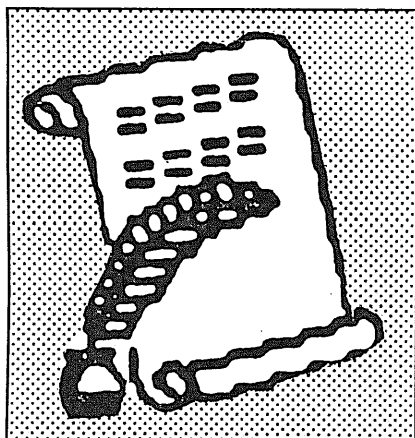
DOOR PRIZES & REFRESHMENTS

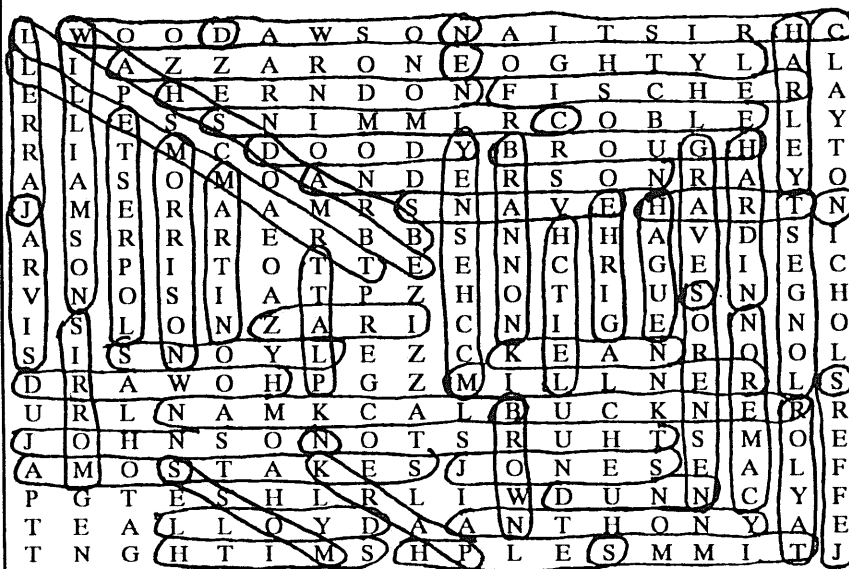

WINSTON CUP SPOTLIGHT - CHAD LITTLE

Chad Little is the young driver of the Fast Fever Racing team's Ford Thunderbird sponsored by Bull's Eye BBQ sauce and Tyson Chicken.

Chad started his career in racing at an early age selling programs and hot dogs at his father's track. At the age of 15 he started racing in a "claimer" division in Spokane, Washington.

In the claimer division, you "claimed" a car when you paid the owner \$499.00. If you brought the car back the following weekend, you got \$200.00 back.

Chad raised money for his early racing ventures by going door-to-door asking for sponsorship money. He always seemed to collect enough to go racing.

After the claimer division, Chad raced Street Stocks and the NASCAR Northwest Tour. However, most of Chad's success has come in the NASCAR West Series.

Chad's first West Series win came in 1986 at Evergreen Speedway where he out ran Bill Elliott. In 1986 Chad received "Rookie of the Year" honors in the Winston West Series.

In 1987, Chad won two races and never finished below third place. Needless to say, in 1987 Chad Little was the Winston West Champion.

In 1988, Chad teamed with long time car owner, Junie Dunlavey to race on the Winston Cup Circuit. With lack of sponsorship money, Chad only competed in 4 races.

In 1989-90 he has ran a limited schedule. 1991 will be Chad's first attempt to run a full season on the Winston Cup Circuit. He recently qualified sixth to give the team their highest qualifying effort yet.

On a personal note, Chad is one of the few single drivers on the Winston Cup Circuit. He graduated from Washington State University in 1985 with a degree in Marketing. Chad continued his education and has earned a law degree.

Look for this bright young man to land in Victory Lane many times in his upcoming career.

SVO 351W POISED FOR RELEASE

We've been hearing rumors of a 351W-based performance motor for months and now it's ready for sale. Developed as Ford's answer to Chevy's High Output 5.7L small-block, this engine will come complete, including distributor, but less carb and exhaust manifolds. The package is based on the two-bolt main 351W marine block, cast-iron crank, and hypereutectic aluminum pistons.

The Motorsport aluminum M-6049-J302 heads will be equipped with roller rocker arms, and a flat-tappet hydraulic cam will be used, although specs are being finalized. A double roller timing chain will also be installed. Under consideration is offering the engine with a choice of a single or dual-plane aluminum intake manifold.

According to one SVO insider, power is expected to be 375 horses. No torque figure was available, but apparently, the goal is to "beat Chevy." Price is to be announced and the engine will be available from all Motorsport parts dealers.
