

RICK'S TIPS
RADIATORS

If you are one of the few who still has the original radiator in your car, please do not toss it in the trash and buy a new one.

1964 through 1966 Mustang radiators are dated with the date appearing stamped into the top of the radiator. This date also matches the striker plate on the door jam. The replacement radiators are very nice and appear to be exact but the numbers are not there. I would recommend re-coring the original radiator. It will cost a little more but after all the radiator is again dated.

1967 to 1968 radiators have Fomoco cast into the top of them - the replacement radiators do not have

Fomoco cast but are almost exact in every other detail.


1969 to 1970 radiators have the part number stamped on the side. The replacement radiators do not have a Ford part number. Again, if you have the original radiator, I would recommend re-coring.

I apologize for not knowing the differences in the 1971 to 1973 cars.

The movie on Crane Cams was shown.


Monte noted that the next meeting will be Wednesday, May 1st.


I hope everyone will attend the upcoming meetings to receive a package. May's package will include items from Fel-Pro gaskets and others.

1994 MUSTANG UPDATE

The following article was taken from the June 1991 Muscle Mustangs and Fast Fords magazine.



With the introduction of the next-generation Mustang approaching (code named "SN95"), more and more information is leaking out about it. As you can see from this rendering, most of the Mustang styling themes are present, but the roofline is obviously different. What you can't see and what insiders tell us is that the most dramatic part of the new car is the view from the front, which is said to resemble the new \$150,000 Aston Martin Virage (another Ford product, don't forget).

Rumors that it would ride on a shortened version of the Thunderbird platform are not true, though it was considered for a short time and ultimately rejected due to the extra weight. No, the rear-drive Fox platform employed since '79 will remain, though wheelbase is expected to be changed. However, no one is saying if it will get longer or shorter. Curb weight should be in the 3000-pound-or-less range.

As far as the powertrain goes, don't expect to see the 280-cid, dual-overhead cam modular V8 in the new car until 1996 at the earliest. In fact, you won't even see the single-overhead cam Romeo V8 until 1995. That means - you guessed it - the venerable pushrod 5.0L motor that powers the current Mustang will be found under the hood of the next generation ponycar when it debuts in '94.

Speaking of the future, the standard Mustang engine is expected to be a 3.0L V6. Ford's use of the V8 is expected to peak in '94, with slightly more than 30 percent of its autos so equipped. The use of 4-cylinder engines is expected to decline and the use of V6s to increase dramatically, including a 30-valve, Yamaha designed SHO motor for the 1997 Thunderbird. This powerplant will replace the supercharged 3.8L now used in the 'Bird. (That car, by the way, will switch to front-wheel drive in '97.)
