Rick's Tips

Phosphating

Phosphating can be identified by a blackish color on nuts and bolts. Those of you who read the various articles in Mustang magazines have noticed phosphating being mentioned in detailing articles. Phosphating is most commonly known as the color on bolts that hold the fenders on 64 - 66 Mustangs.

Basically to phosphate metal, the metal must be degreased and then all paint and rust must be removed usually by some type of media blasting, i.e. glass, sand or iron oxide. Once the metal is bare and grease free the phosphate is chemically applied. Directly after the phosphate has been applied oil should be applied. Some people have recommended coal oil. I like an oil with a Teflon base.

Ford phosphated back in the 60's because it was an inexpensive way to keep nuts and bolts from rusting for a short period. Phosphating was not the best way to protect metal but was certainly one of the cheapest.

Once phosphated, rust can be seen on some of the parts within 5 days. The rust is usually light but none the less it will sometimes appear this quick. I have talked to others who have had phosphating done on various parts and with coal oil (which is very thick) rust will begin to form after 3-4 months. For phosphating to last no moisture should be allowed near the pieces. Apparently oil will help to stop rust from beginning to form.

OIL PAN GASKET LEAKAGE CAUSED BY OIL PAN DEFORMATION

(C4 Three-Speed Automatic Transmission - 1965 Mustang)


Oil pan gasket leaks encountered on the subject model C-4 three-speed automatic transmissions can be caused by deformation of the oil pan at the bolt holes. This pan deformation is caused by the bolt and lock washer combination. To eliminate pan deformation, a new washer head bolt, part number 37878-2-S, was released for production on Job #1, 1965 (August 1964) and is now available for service use.

To correct oil pan gasket leaks on models with the bolt and lock washer combination, the following procedure is recommended:

1. Remove the transmission oil pan.
2. Discard the oil pan attaching bolts, lock washers and oil pan gasket.
3. Clean the transmission oil pan in a suitable solvent.
4. Inspect the transmission oil pan mounting flange for excessive deformation around the oil pan bolt holes. Repair or replace the oil pan as necessary.
5. Attach the oil pan and gasket to the transmission case using the new 378782-S bolts (11 required).
6. Torque the oil pan bolts to 12-16 lb. ft. Do not over-torque pan bolts.
7. Fill the transmission to the specified level. If new fluid is used it must meet Ford specification. NOTE: 1964 model C-4 transmission was used in 1965 Mustangs until August, 1964.

REMOTE CONTROL MIRROR CABLE FAILURE (All Mustang)

Recent field reports indicate that inoperative remote control mirrors are attributed to adjustment cable disengagement when attempts are made to adjust the mirror by forcing the mirror if the mirror is frozen within the mirror head assembly. Corrective action has been taken to assure cable retention by crimping the cables in the actuator assembly.



Complaints of this problem may be corrected by removing the actuator assembly, reinstalling the cable and crimping the retaining tabs to secure the cable ferrules to the actuator assembly. It is not necessary to replace the mirror assembly to correct complaints attributed to cable disengagement.

CRACKS IN SEALER AND POOR APPEARANCE OF SEALER IN DRIP RAILS

(1969 - Mustang Without Vinyl Top)

Some early built 1969 Mustang vehicles without the vinyl roof have revealed cracks in the sealer and/or a poor sealer appearance between the quarter roof and roof rail. Occasionally these problems will result from the difficulty encountered during the installation of the rear outside quarter window moldings.

In the event you are confronted with objectionable drip rail sealer appearance and/or cracks in the roof drip rail, a satisfactory repair can be accomplished by the following procedure.

1. Clean area of drip rail of any loose or foreign material.
2. Apply sufficient amount of ESB-M4-G-103-A air dry vinyl sealer to cover the joint of the roof to the drip rail extension. (In the case of hairline cracks, assure that the sealer is worked into the crack.)
3. Smooth out vinyl sealer with wooden dowel or other applicable tool which has been moistened with solvent (naphtha).
4. Clean off any excess sealer from adjacent area.
5. Allow the sealer to dry for 15 minutes, then with touch-up brush, apply air dry lacquer or enamel in the appropriate color to the sealer.

NOTE: The M4-G-103-A sealer will quickly skin over permitting the application of the touch-up paint; however, the sealer will not dry through for 48 hours. Therefore, handling precautions must be exercised.

In either case it is not necessary to paint the entire roof panel.

NOTE: The air dry vinyl sealer is manufactured by the Ohio Sealer and Chemical Co., 3060 East River Road, Dayton, Ohio (45439) and is merchandised in five (5) ounce tubes or 1/10 gallon cartridges. Your requirements may be ordered directly from this source or from local body shop suppliers under trade name "AU-VE-CO" Automotive Body Sealer.
