I hear the Scavenger Hunt was a success. Unfortunately I had to work and couldn't be there, but I would like to thank Nellie and Brenda for a job well done.

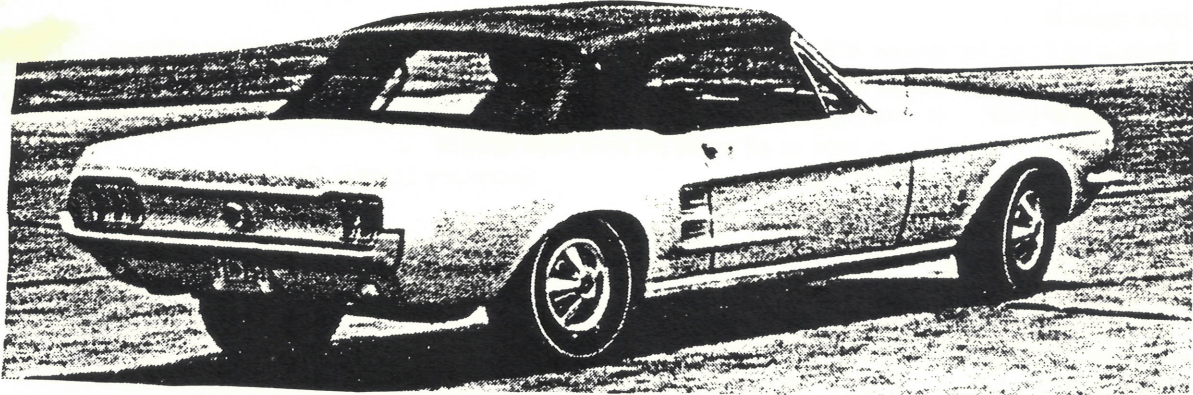
We are out of trouble with MCA. Al says we are back on their roster. If any of you would like to join MCA just see Al at the meeting.

Rick's Tips

Repro Starter Solenoids

The over all appearance between the repro and the original is close but before you invest in a repro you might want to clean up your original. Original's can still be found in salvage yards but you will have to take a chance that it still works and will not break while out on the road.

New old stock (NOS) starters solenoids are extremely expensive however there are still some out there for under \$100.00. A junk yard solenoid will cost you about five dollars but the cadum plating is usually has deteriorated and will come out grey upon cleaning with a chrome cleaner. Some people will paint the tops but the originals were plated and the only way to duplicate plating is to replate.

The repro solenoids have the correct stampings but the body is very plastic looking. Both the black body (66-73) and the red body (64-early 65) have a plastic looking appearance that is different from the originals. To put the reproduction and original side by side makes the reproduction's main body twice as shinny as the original. The original main body besides being duller in appearance also has some specks of white throught out. The people advertising that repros are exact are incorrect. Also the bottom plates on some of the originals have a breather hole with a cotton plug in it.

Some people have begun to rebuild and replate originals. The cost is between \$70 and \$100. I do question the condition of the main bodies on these rebuilt units because most of the time heat has damaged and discolored original units, people rebuilding these reuse the original body and replate the individual pieces.
