CENTRAL VIRGINIA MUSTANG CLUB BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

The CVMC Board of Directors met March 12, 1994, at the home of Kenny and Nellie Fischer. The meeting was called to order at 4:50 pm. Present were: President Kenny Fischer, First Vice-President Tom Barnett, Secretary Debbie Shaver, National Director Don Lane, and Directors Carroll Lipscombe, Richard Jones, George Cosier, David Lythgoe, and William Jarvis.

Kenny discussed the questionnaire from Rick's Restoration that was distributed at the January general membership meeting. The suggestion was made to hold the workshops approximately quarterly and to have them last about two hours. The first workshop is tentatively scheduled for May 14, from 9:30-11:00 am, with Rick's approval and verification of a speaker.

Kenny reminded everyone of the Azalea Parade coming up on April 23. Ben Beale of the Late Great Chevy Club has asked if the CVMC would be interested in helping with the activities in Forest Hill Park after the parade. He indicated to Kenny and Carroll the responsibilities would be to oversee the food and drink vendors (show them where to set up, etc). He would provide a list of 6-10 vendors who are willing to participate but we would be welcome to invite any more we could find. We would keep the vendor fee (about \$15.00 per vendor) charged in exchange for our manpower. This could become a permanent affiliation. About 2000-4000 people are expected to eat after the parade, but we would only need about four people to organize the vendors. The Department of Parks supplies the tables and chairs. Carroll asked Kenny to find out how much money the Chevy Club made and what responsibility for clean-up is involved. Kenny has also been approached about participating in a car club display at the park after the parade.

Kenny reported he spoke with the assistant manager of the Chester Wal-Mart concerning locating our car show in their parking lot. The idea sounded good to him but he needed higher approval with management and would be in touch. No word yet. Dick Strauss Ford is interested. Universal Ford is interested. Of these three options, it would be preferable to hold the show at a dealership and tie in with 30th Anniversary Celebrations. Tom is pursuing some other alternatives and hopes to have more information in time for the April general membership meeting.

Carroll announced that Ford will be having a tent sale at the Fairgrounds on Strawberry Hill in May and would like some of our cars for display.

Brenda Jones will attend the WRVA Community Club Awards kick-off dinner this week as the CVMC representative. She also asked if the club might possibly be interested in doing a cruise/display/show next March at Southern Seminary College in Buena Vista, tied in with their annual horse show. Tom suggested they contact the Roanoke and Lynchburg clubs.

Adjourned 7:20 pm.

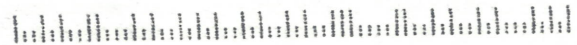
