

The Central Virginia Mustang Club met August 3, 1994 at Richmond Ford. The meeting was called to order at 7:35 pm by President Kenny Fischer. Guests Bill Grimes and Joan Tucker were greeted. Birthday wishes were extended to those persons born in August. Best wishes and congratulations were wished to Brenda and Richard Jones celebrating their 20th anniversary and to Linda and George Cosier on their up-coming anniversary.

Second Vice President Don Smith reported 66 paid members. Treasurer Donnie Nichols reported a beginning balance of \$1192.05 with deposits of 166.00, deductions of 735.00 for a final balance of \$623.05. National Director Don Lane has put together a letter to send to car clubs in driving distance to invite them to our show in September. Nellie Fischer requested articles of interest for the newsletter. She also has ticket books for the quilt raffle. Carroll Lipscombe reported no information concerning cruises. Karen Lane reminded folks of the up-coming excursion on the Annabel Lee scheduled for August 28. Brenda Jones presented the refreshments and doorprizes. Marty Belt reported NASCAR is making qualifying "more fair" by reversing the field for second day qualifying. David Lythgoe was not present to report on the judges workshop held recently at Rick Nockta's shop. Kenny Fischer reported that the session was very productive.

Brenda reported that the Community Club Award group will soon have a training meeting to distribute information concerning earning a portion of \$29,000.00 at the end of 13 weeks. Points are accumulated by purchasing specific goods or services.

There are two cars for sale on the board, for anyone interested.

The question was raised concerning the new emission requirements -- cars 25 years and older are exempt.

First Vice President Tom Barnett discussed the car show. There is a need for volunteers--to be judges, work the registration desk, direct vehicles, to act as go-fers, etc. There is a list being circulated.. Please sign up! Approximately 25 people are needed.

There will be a "run through" with the volunteers soon. "Official" shirts will be provided for everyone who volunteers for ease of identification at the show. Perhaps a sponsor would be willing to pay for the shirts.

MCA still doesn't have our show listed in Mustang Times. Two MCA officials have been invited to be the guests of the Shockhoe Slip Merchant's Association but have not as yet returned their RSVP.

There is a 1965 Cobra valued at \$250,000 promised to come -- Tom requested a special trophy for the car. Kenny pointed out the need for additional trophies because the show is expanded. We typically have a sponsor for each class with the sponsor's name on each trophy. The cost is about \$75.00 per class for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place trophies. Merchandise is also being accepted for doorprizes/raffles the day of the show. To satisfy sponsor's desire for advertisement from the show, it was discussed to print a one page front/back program to list classes and sponsors.

SSMA wants 4-6 cars for display in the James Center for the week before the show. The production date for the '95 Mustang to be raffled for the lease-use for 30 days will be August 22. Hopefully the car will arrive in time to also be on display at the James Center. Need to get the raffle tickets printed. To qualify for the lease, the person must be 21 years old, and be a licensed driver. Tom will confer with the SSMA concerning requiring the person to be present to win. The general consensus is that less tickets will be sold if the winner must be present as this also will not allow tickets to be sold other than the day of the show. Nellie will take care of having the tickets printed.

### Rick's Tips

#### 1967 - 1968 Mouldings Repro vs. Ford

The grille moulding I am about to discuss are the thin skinny moulding that are below the grille and above the front bumpers. They appear as follows.




The Repro mouldings are made of soft metal and will bend very badly upon installation. Also no attaching clips will come with the repro. The Ford mouldings are stronger made than the repro and are easier to install. The original mouldings also come with the correct attaching clips and nuts.

It is best to use the ford pieces because the repros will probably end up in the trash.


