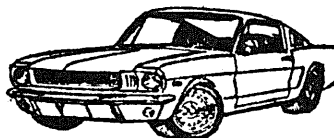
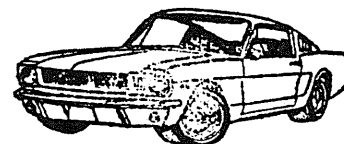

Kenny thanked everyone who participated in the Asphalt Angels show at The Showplace in February. And a special thanks to Don Lane for handling the arrangements. Everyone from CVMC who participated took home a trophy and/or a cash award.

The decision was made to hold the meeting for the show immediately following the Adopt-A-Highway trash pick-up on March 25, at the Pizza Hut in Midlothian. Anyone interested in the meeting but not the trash pick-up should meet at the Pizza Hut about 11:30 am.

Lonnie had a technical question: he wants to paint the console black-on-chrome. How to do it? Kenny answered that he needs to use a zinc chromite coat then Euro black gloss, made especially for chrome black-out areas.

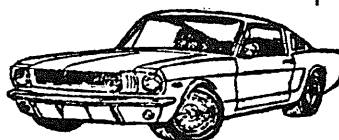

LMMOA 2nd ANNUAL LATE MODEL ROUND-UP INFORMATION

July 5-6-7-8, 1995 - Atlanta, Georgia

Our second annual national convention will take place at Atlanta, Georgia and its something you won't want to miss. Like last year, we're holding it in conjunction with the Shelby American Automobile Club's national convention. Because its their 20th Anniversary, they're expecting over 5,000 people and 1,000 Shelby Mustangs, Cobras, GT40's, Panteras, Tigers, Boss 302 and 429s and just about every other type of Ford powered performance car you can name. Carroll Shelby, himself, is expected to attend this event.

As we go to press a few of the details for this event are still being finalized. The following is a preliminary schedule of what you can expect. The only major change that may occur is on Thursday. The closest drag strip to Atlanta is over an hour and a half away. We are currently talking with a new drag strip that is opening approximately 45 minutes from the convention hotels. If we are able to put a drag race program together for Thursday, details will be included in the next issue of *Fox Tails*.

WEDNESDAY, JULY 5th. This day can be classified as arrival day. You should plan on arriving the day before the convention "officially" begins. this way you will be able to relax a little. After you check in to your hotel you'll want to find LMMOA Registration. It will be set up at Atlanta Motor Speedway (AMS) between 12pm and 5pm. If your running the open track on Thursday, this is the perfect time to get your car through Tech Inspection. The Swap Meet will be in full swing at AMS. That evening, back at the hotel, a "Used Car Lot" will be set up. Inside, an art and literature show will be going on. And if that's not enough, there will be a popular vote model car contest taking place with 3 classes based on age.

THURSDAY, JULY 6th. The first "real" day of the convention. The track gates open at 6 am and you can expect a long line of cars waiting to get in. LMMOA Registration will be open from 6am to 3pm. A mandatory Driver's Meeting will be held at 8 am for each day of the open track. We will be using AMS' 2.5-mile road course and the event will be run like last year. The LMMOA will have its own run group: wall to wall late-model Mustangs! Also like last year, passengers will be allowed. There will also be a kid's session during the lunch break. The swap meet will run for the entire convention. Thursday evening will feature a cocktail party for all members and their guests. We are in the process of lining up some guest speakers for a tech question and answer session as well.

FRIDAY, JULY 7th. Friday will essentially be a rerun of Thursday: Open Track and Parts Swap will fill the day at the track. Our annual convention dinner and evening program will be held back at the hotel. Dress is casual - shorts and t-shirts if you want.

SATURDAY, JULY 8th. Because some people never get enough track time we've added Saturday for those who would rather give rides than park their cars for the car show. The Parts Swap will continue, and the Popular Vote Car Show will take place in the morning and mid-day. Trophies will be awarded immediately following the show (we figure around 4 pm). This will allow everyone to get an early start for the trip home or to head back to the hotel for one last night of comradarie and carousing.

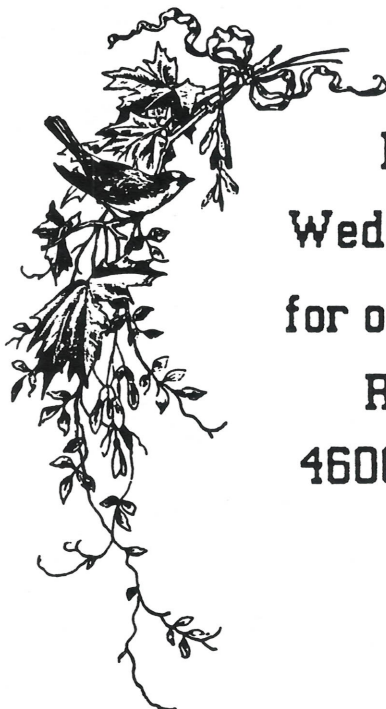
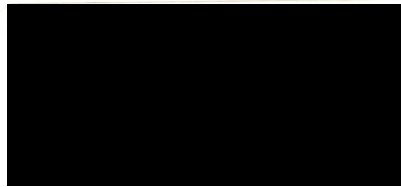
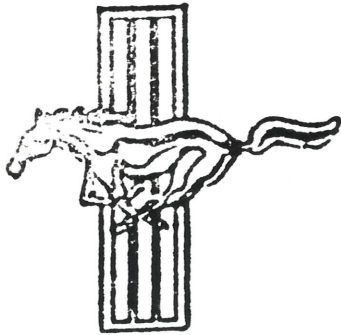
