Welcome Members,


First of all I would like to thank Carroll for getting some cars for the Azalea Parade. We had a good time, all of the ponies made it without any trouble.



Sumit Point, W Va.

Sumit Point in West Va. host 2-4 Vintage race cars a year. This year I was able to attend the SVRA (Sportcar Vintage Race Association) Race.

Sumit Point is four hours from Richmond up near Winchester. It is best to stay in Winchester and drive the 30 to 40 minutes to the raceway. Also try to be at the track at 7:00 am for practice sessions.
