

OCTOBER 4, 1995

The October meeting of the Central Virginia Mustang Club was called to order at 7:36 pm by First Vice-President Don Lane. There were five prospective new members present: Drew Holtsman with a '65 coupe, Ike Sieford with a '68 convertible, Milton Harmon with a '69 fastback GT, Todd Evan with a '95 GT coupe, and Craig Eggleton with a '94 Cobra coupe with a supercharger. Birthday greetings were extended to members with October birthdays. A special welcome was extended to Rachel Shaver, the youngest member attending her first CVMC meeting since her birth on September 26, also noted to be Carroll Lipscombe's birthdate -- congratulations to Debbie and Steve!

Treasurer George Cosier read the following figures for the show monies taken in: raffles \$399.00, registration \$1724.00, programs \$415.00, trophy class sponsors \$280.00. Expenses: public address system \$161.94 (one-time expense), trophies \$1319.84, notepads \$51.21, hats \$140.40, flyers \$18.90 + \$50.35, raffle ticket printing \$41.90, program printing \$82.67, newspaper advertisement \$128.80, towing trailer \$5.00 = \$2001.01 for a net gain of \$816.99. The final CVMC account balance is \$1512.22.

National Director Paul Oliver reported the Mustang Museum has been incorporated in Michigan, cars will probably be rotated through much like the Corvette Museum in Kentucky, he suggests CVMC consider a donation to the museum to help fund-raising efforts. Carroll Lipscombe suggests waiting until next meeting to make that decision, allowing club members to consider the gesture. Paul also has brochures for everyone concerning the 20th Anniversary Celebration cruise MCA is sponsoring next August on the Royal Caribbean's Sovereign of the Seas to the Bahamas, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.

Director Carroll Lipscombe listed the following up-coming parades:

1) October 14 is the Octoberfest Parade, see Richard Dawson, they need convertibles for dignitaries; 2) October 21 is the Midlothian Village Parade at 10:00 am; 3) December 3 is the Chester Christmas Parade, need to send in our registration fee if there is enough interest. Karen Lane needs money from the treasury to finalize plans for the Holiday Party, scheduled for December 16. Brenda Jones introduced the doorprizes and described the refreshments. Carroll mentioned that the Fords placed first and second on Sunday at North Wilkesboro. Don Lane thanked the judges for a job well done at the car show in September. There were 121 cars entered, 7 vendors, 6 car corrals, and about ten vehicles outside our ropes to avoid paying a fee to park a car for sale. Tom Barnett asked for a round of applause for those whose hard work and dedication made the car show a success. Karen Lane mentioned that President Kenny Fischer wants to hold a meeting soon to discuss the car show, changes to make next year, etc. Brenda reports that Dorrie Sundquist at Willow Lawn suggests getting on the Willow Lawn calendar now for next year's show, need to contact Argie (Dorrie's replacement as she has moved to the Virginia Beach area). This will allow the merchants plenty of time to prepare for the show as well. Some merchants claimed to know nothing about the show until the day of the show, however, nothing but praise has been heard from the merchants.

Rick Nochta held a show-and-tell concerning consoles. They cost about \$190.00 and must be painted to match the interior of each car.

However, there are several manufacturing flaws in the consoles, which cannot be returned after they have been painted. The center chrome is too high, the ashtray door won't open (jammed), the drilled holes don't match with the originals on the chrome insert, and the chrome at the front sets up too high.

CVMC member Wayne Myers showed the video he and his wife made at the car show. Wonderful work!! They own a business "All Occasion Video" that they would also like to advertise. Copies of the video are available to club members.

Don't forget the election coming up. There was one technical question concerning wiring to the headlamps/signals that was answered by Richard Jones.

### Rick's Tips

#### Comparisons: Sandblasting, Glass bead blasting, Plastic media blasting, & Iron oxide.

To remove old paint, rust etc. from cars is done a variety of ways. The four basic ways are sandblasting, glass beading, plastic media blasting and iron oxide.

Sandblasting uses using silicia sand. Silicia sand is mined at particular location in the country so that sand size is kept consistent. It is not like beach sand which is smooth. The sandblasting sand has sharp corners which cut the rust, old paint etc. as it hits the surface. Beach sand can not be used because it has become smooth thru ocean movement. Silicia sand is forced thru a hose using air pressure and hits the surface of metal at about 10 miles an hour. because of this, metal can warp and the blasting process should be done by someone who is knowledgeable concerning of sandblasting sheet metal.

Glass beading is mainly used on aluminum because it does not distort the aluminum as sand will (It is not as hard as sand) It uses air pressure to force it through a hose and blast off paint and rust. When you see an aluminum intake that looks new it has been sandblasted.

Plastic media is also forced through a hose and is actually plastic beads. It causes less damage to the metal than sand or glass but will not remove bondo or rust. It is very expensive.

Iron oxide is iron particals also forced through a hose using air pressure. It is very harsh and can burn holes through the metal. It will tear up aluminum and brass. I do not recommend this for automobiles.




