
If anybody is still thinging about the trip to Tangier Island on June 1st. please let me know or call Brenda Jones.



The March meeting of the Central Virginia Mustang Club was called to order by President Kenny Fischer at 7:38 pm. He showed a custom truck in the recent Asphalt Angels show at the Showplace. He also owns Mustangs.

Treasurer George Cosier reported a beginning balance of \$1160.80 minus \$60.47 (newsletter) minus \$97.78 (phone & line installation) minus \$25.00 (Belmont reservation fee) plus \$325.00 (dues) for a final balance of \$1303.05. The monies collected for the race tickets will pay for a motor for the Olds nicely. National Director Paul Oliver plans to attend the MCA meeting next Tuesday in Atlanta. His daughter Karen is back from Okinawa and plans to be married later this month.

Meet at the McDonalds at 9:00. Kenny has been in contact with the folks at Hooters and car display shows have been planned for June 23 on the southside and for August 25 on Broad Street. Adopt-A-Highway trash pick-up will be March 23. Meet at the Midlothian K-Mart at 9:00 am. Lunch to follow at the Midlothian Pizza Hut.

Nellie has merchandise for anyone interested. Linda Cosier requested thicker t-shirts and better quality golf shirts. Karen Lane confirmed December 14 for the Holiday Party. Brenda Jones has researched the proposed trip to Tangier Island scheduled for June 1. The boat departs at 10:00 am, with boarding at 9:30 am., and returns at 3:30 pm. We need at least 25 people to qualify for the group rate. The cost is \$16.65 for adults, \$8.32 for children ages 4-13, and infants ride free. The Chesapeake House family style restaurant is \$11.25 for adults and \$5.62 for children age five and under. The cruise people will make the reservations if desired. A deposit of \$100.00 is due my May 1. A quick count of members interested was about 15. Brenda introduced the refreshments and doorprizes. Bonnie Fischer needs photographs for the club scrapbook.

Kenny reminded members to check the bulletin board during the break. Monte Evans has listed his 1984½ Anniversary car for sale. The mailboxes painted by Kenny to match the cars were a nice touch to the club display, which was won by CVMC for the second year in a row. Kenny will make mailboxes for anyone interested for a nominal charge. Susan Morris held hers up for display. There are still 2 tickets available for the fall race at RIR. The spring race is likely to move to May or June, and possibly become a night race. Kenny reported the Car Council met recently and discussed the notification from Senator Warner that the "clunker bill" has been scrapped and emission testing scheduled for July has been put on hold for a few years. Henrico County tried a few years ago to tax classic cars and failed due to inequitable assessing. Chesterfield County is checking into creating a "blue book" for classic cars which would be graded 1 -3. Who would do the grading? The Car Council recommends no cooperation.

The program for the up-coming CVMC car show is in the works. We need advertisements and donations. Rick Nohta inquired about more space at Willow Lawn. We have been promised more show space this year. There are no notices appearing in the magazines yet.

Big Block Mustangs.....

In our Newsletter a couple of months ago there appeared an article about Ford's soon to be released Boss 429 and 427 cu.in. big blocks being offered for sale in new Mustangs. The article further stated that Ford's Motorsports Division had developed the cars and they would soon be available through Ford dealers.

A friend of mine Thomas Victory who recently visited Dearborn was fortunate enough to talk to the Chief Design Engineer at Ford, Mr. Jim Hasse. Mr. Victory upon meeting Mr. Hasse requested to take his picture however could not because the new 1998 engines were displayed in his office and my friend was asked not to take pictures.

Well to make a long story short: Mr. Hasse stated that no cars were developed with big blocks in the new Mustangs. He further stated that an independent is supposedly developing the Boss 429 and 427 cu.in. engines but has not done so. The car will not be marked by Ford.

Local Laws

One of the things the council wanted to do was discover the local laws that cover autos. Examples are: How many unlicensed cars can you have in your yard? What are the penalties for unlicensed, non-running cars? How are these laws or rules enforced?

I contacted Chesterfield officials to find out the following:

Chesterfield County Laws for Automobiles

Con't from last month

Inoperative vehicle - also handled by the license inspector on a complaint basis only. An inoperative vehicle is one without a valid inspection sticker or one missing major parts (code 1441-27.1). These vehicles have rules similiar to unlicensed vehicles.

Parts or parts of vehicles - zoning inspector (748-1050) handles these. After several calls to the zoning inspector, I kept getting his voice mail. I remember speaking to someone in the Planning Department about parts of vehicles. These are eyesores and must be removed. The inspector works on complaints similiar to the license inspector.


