It sounds like we are going to have a busy year.

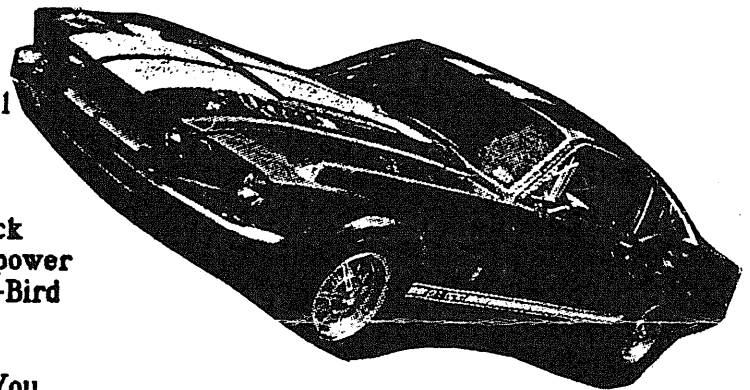

One of the things the council wanted to do was discover the local laws that cover autos. Examples are: How many unlicensed cars can you have in your yard? What are the penalties for unlicensed, non-running cars? How are these laws or rules enforced?

I contacted Chesterfield officials to find out the following:

### Chesterfield County Laws for Automobiles

**Personal property taxes** - Taxes are \$3.60 per \$100 of value. Value is the average loan in the NADA book that comes out in January of the tax year. This year only 1979-1996 vehicles are covered in this book. Therefore there are no taxes for 1978 and older vehicles. County stickers must be purchased in January. Most are \$20, but trucks in excess of 4000 pounds are charged \$25 to \$45 depending on weight. All taxes and stickers are pro-rated. For example a sticker purchased in September would be reduced from the \$20 fee - same for property taxes. Commisioner of Revenue handles this - 748-1281.

**Unlicensed Vehicles** - vehicles that are complete, but do not have license plates. There is a limit of one vehicle per residence (unless garaged - then code 1441-20 does not apply). This vehicle must be moved to the rear of the property and completely covered. The license inspector's office (748-1229) will respond only to complaints because of the small staff. Any car covered but not licensed is subject to a \$100 fee per year. Any more than one vehicle must be removed or placed in an enclosed garage. A summons can be issued for general district court. The maximum fine is \$250 plus court costs - and vehicles will be removed.

Dear Mr. Frann:

Knowing of your interest in a provision in the National Highway System Designation Act concerning the voluntary scrappage of older model automobiles, I wanted to be sure that you were aware that this matter was not included in the final version of the bill.

This provision in the Senate bill was intended to simply remove the federal limitation on states using Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) funds for vehicle scrappage. There was no mandate for states to implement vehicle scrappage programs with CMAQ funds, nor was there any mandate for persons to participate in a state-sponsored program if one was established.


Let me be clear that I do not support any programs which force persons to sell an automobile of any age or a program which would interfere with a persons right to collect or sell vintage automobiles.

Due to the concerns expressed about this provision, I consulted with my colleagues and it was not part of the bill signed into law.

## Legislative Report

These bills were introduced in the General Assembly:

1. A bill to change the clunker scrappage law to a law to allow the repair of polluting vehicles. This bill has passed a senate subcommittee.
2. A bill to increase speed limits from 65 to 70 and 55 to 60. This was killed in committee.
3. A bill to make not wearing seat bills a primary (sole reason for stopping a motorist) offense. Status unknown.
4. A bill to reduce new car dealer fees from a high of \$250 to a set fee of \$25. This is the fee you pay to process a new vehicle purchase. Status unknown.
5. A bill to make it mandatory to turn on your lights when your wipers are on. Status unknown.

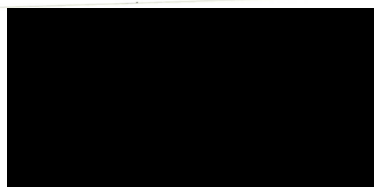
