The September meeting of the Central Virginia Mustang Club was called to order at 7:43 pm by President Kenny Fischer. There were no new members or guests present. Birthday greetings were extended to those members and their families with birthdays in September. Second Vice-President Terry Wagner reported 78 paid members. Treasurer George Cosier reported a beginning balance of \$580.70 minus \$130.25 (printing newsletter & flyers) minus \$21.05 (phone) minus \$84.29 (frame print) minus \$81.77 (print newsletter & flyers) plus \$457.50 for a final balance of \$720.85. There is an additional \$1300 cash received to be deposited from race ticket sales.

National Director Paul Oliver has Mustang Museum decals for 21 members. CVMC has 94 points towards the President's Club Award.

This can also be done, but no decisions will be made until after the car show. Hopefully, new shirts can be ordered and received in time for the 1997 car show season, starting in February. Several members of the club are particularly interested in having club shirts before the National Show in Virginia Beach next May. Karen had no report on picnics and parties except to remind members of the Holiday Party scheduled for December 14. Brenda reported that we have more than 35 doorprizes for the car show. There will be a goodie-bag stuffing session at Brenda's house Friday night, September 6. Dash plaques will go in the goodie-bag. First Vice-President Don Lane reminded members that there will be a judges meeting in conjunction with the show meeting on Sunday. Rain date for the meeting will be Monday night at 7:00 pm.

Kenny read items from the bulletin board. No description was necessary for the compromising photograph of Richard taken during the recent trip to The Mustang Club of America's 20th Mustang Anniversary Celebration in Atlanta. Several club members attended the celebration, although none showed cars. Tickets to the spring race at Richmond International Raceway are available to members on a first come, first served, cash basis. Tickets went fast. Thank you to everyone who supported the Styling Stangs show at the Super-K in August. We expect reciprocal support from their club. Thank you to the members who brought their cars out to Hooters for the display show.

Show notes: Don't forget the show meeting at the Jones' house Sunday at 4:00 pm. There will be pizza to eat. Please sell raffle tickets. There will be no radio station. We will have a DJ, a person works with Kenny. Please bring CDs, labeled with your name, for him to play. Preferably music from the 50s, 60s, and 70s. The newspaper advertisement will run from mid-week. Kenny will contact the newspaper regarding their specials. Carroll is taking care of the trailer from Cheek & Shockley. Plan to arrive about 6:00 am. Registration begins at 8:00 am. Rachel Shaver will peddle raffle tickets in the registration line.

SHOW MEETING
SEPTEMBER 8, 1996

The Central Virginia Mustang Club held a meeting on Sunday, September 8, 1996, at the home of Richard and Brenda Jones to discuss the up-coming car show. In attendance were the following: Kenny & Nellie Fischer, Don & Karen Lane, Steve, Debbie, & Rachel Shaver, Richard & Brenda Jones, Lonnie & Joan Tucker, Al & Kay Brough, Carroll Lipscombe, David Lythgoe, Manny Nichols, Mark McChesney, and Rusty Wiseman. The meeting was called to order at 4:45 pm.

Kenny discussed space limitations set by Willow Lawn. We will not be able to use space directly in front of merchants such as Starbucks Coffee or Barnes & Nobles. We have been granted space to the right of the main entrance island. Trailers will be parked in this area. The show trailer, which Carroll secured for us from Cheek & Shockley, will be positioned in the middle of the show area. A person will be located on the main drive to direct cars into registration lines or to the pre-registered table. We presently have 53 pre-registered vehicles.

Vendor space will be limited. They will need to unhook their trailers and park trailers to the right of the main drive. Vendors will be limited to 2 parking spaces each. There are presently 5 vendors pre-registered.

The corner area has eighty parking spaces. We will allow 1½ spaces per vehicle. We will be able to separate cars by year but not by body style. The front corner area will be reserved for '64½ - '73 model cars. Late models will be parked down Willow Lawn Drive, with Ford-powered vehicles at the end/entrance. We will not charge a car corral fee, but will ask anyone interested to park their vehicles in the spaces reserved for customers of the merchants. Modifieds will be grouped by year with the non-modifieds.

Registration opens before 8:00 am. There will be 12 dozen donuts available. There will be no technical inspection but a judge will be needed at registration to help with class selection. There will be one line for pre-registered vehicles and two lines for registering vehicles. Susan, Karen, Joan, and Kay will work the registration area.

There will be a judges meeting 30 minutes before the judging starts, about an hour after registration ends. Tie-breakers will be re-judged by the head judge, especially for Best in Show. We will once again give as many trophies as possible. Scores within about 5 points will be considered a tie.

Need to push the raffle tickets. Someone will be needed to solicit car to car. Rachel will sell tickets at the registration lines. The Hooter's Girls are supposed to come. Perhaps they can sell raffle tickets.

Brenda can possibly get tables and chairs from the Tuckahoe Rescue Squad. They have recently gotten new furnishings and are getting rid of the old ones.

We have our public address system to use, but a friend of Kenny's has offered to serve as disc jockey for the day. Please bring CD with music from the '50s, '60s, and '70s. He will provide the microphone for announcing doorprizes. Paul Oliver will not be there, so we need someone to announce. Perhaps Terry Wagner will be available.

We won't need much help parking cars. Plan to use the directional tripods again. Wear the red OFFICIAL shirts, judges have new hats.

Don will not assign classes until registration. He will position himself at the registration table to answer questions and also to begin filling out the judging sheets for each individual car. The judging sheets will be in duplicate this year, safer in the event of a protest. Lonnie donated the duplicate sheets. The sheets do not have an area for the vehicle owner's name, perhaps it is more fair this way. The new judges sheets are available for discussion. Steve suggested leaving the inspection of the data plate versus car color off, since that matters only for concours cars. A duplicate line concerning inspection of the body alignment was omitted

A Beginners Prospective


