CENTRAL VIRGINIA MUSTANG CLUB
FEBRUARY 3, 1999

The February meeting of the Central Virginia Mustang Club was called to order by President Kenny Fischer. There were no new members or guests present. Birthday salutations were extended to members with birth dates in February. Rick Nochta has received information through the Victory 7 club from a DC area Mustang club that would like to caravan to Charlotte in April with as many Mustangs as possible. Most of our group plan to leave on Thursday, although some folks will have to work part of the day.

Second Vice-president Susan Morris reported that we have 44 paid members. New membership cards have been mailed (if not picked up in person), please contact her if you have not received it yet. Treasurer George Cosier reported a beginning balance of \$2474.69 minus \$23.31 (phone) minus \$74.87 (Holiday party: \$50.00 deposit, \$24.87 directors trophies) minus \$35.90 (sponsor wild mustang) minus \$1505.00 (RIR) plus \$279.00 (collected RIR ticket moneys & dues) plus \$559.00 (dues) for a final balance of \$1673.61.

Carroll has received information regarding the Azalea Parade scheduled for April 24. We will meet at George Wythe High School and step off at 10:30 AM. The parade is about 1½ miles long. He has no information regarding the St. Patrick's Day parade yet.

Nellie brought up the 1999 Holiday party for discussion. We would be able to reserve the Belmont Recreation Center, where we have had the party for several years, for December 18, the Saturday night immediately prior to Christmas. This was the same weekend as the party was held last year (1998) and attendance was lower than in previous years. We have to pay to rent the room and pay for the ABC license. Mike Young has offered the use of the clubhouse in the Kings Charter subdivision, where he lives. However, the clubhouse is only available to us on Friday, December 10, from 6:00-11:00 PM. We would not have to pay any rent, nor would we have to pay for an ABC license. Last year the facility provided a Christmas tree. The facility also has a separate kitchen, a fireplace, a big screen TV and ample rest rooms. Mike has put down a \$200.00 totally refundable deposit for us. A vote was taken on the two locations and appeared nearly unanimous for the Kings Charter location.

We have 7 cars registered for the Asphalt Angels show. Those participating are the Lanes, Cosiers, Fischers, Lipscombes, Herbert Hudson, and Ed Adams (two cars).

Kenny outlined the two options regarding CVMC members showing their own cars at our show in September. Donnie Nichols would like an informal poll of other regional clubs. Lynchburg and Charlottesville restrict their club members, as do all North Carolina regional clubs. George pointed out that we can't afford to allow display cars to pay no registration fee, with the purpose of the show being to pay club bills. Our major bill is the \$1 million liability insurance policy we carry. This policy covers all club functions throughout the year. Carroll would like to see more members display their cars, the purpose for club members being to put on a show for other participants. Kenny has tried to solicit judges from other clubs, but to no avail. Our members traditionally provide most of the judges for Styling Stangs, but they only have a couple of members who even participate in our show. Rick suggests it is the more novice participants who don't recognize the better cars that are more likely to complain. Kenny reported that 35% of our show participants are CVMC members with 10% display only. Bob Overbey has "lived" for our show for three years, but doesn't mind paying the fee to display. Ballots were distributed and collected following the break. The vote was 21 in favor of leaving the decision to the club member, 12 in favor of restricting a club member from showing, and 2 votes were neutral.

National Director Paul Oliver encouraged everyone to call their State Senator in favor of passing the 25-year rolling emission bill. The bill was recently passed by the House of Representatives. This bill would allow antique cars greater than 25 years of age to be exempt from the emissions testing.

Guest speaker Fred Fann, the President of the Car Club Council, spoke concerning legislation before the current General Assembly that relates to motor vehicles. There is a list of legislation 7 single spaced pages long relating to motor vehicles. Some of it good, some of it less so.
