CENTRAL VIRGINIA MUSTANG CLUB  
OCTOBER 6, 1999

The October meeting of the Central Virginia Mustang Club was called to order by President Kenny Fischer at 7:34 PM. New members and guests present included: Charlie Helmer, who owns a '89 convertible LX and a 2000 couple; Steven Gray, who owns a '66 convertible; Dick & MaryAnn Hager, who own a '95 SVT Cobra; and Danny & Scott Garner, who own a Boss 302 (original owner!). Danny has been acquainted with Don Smith since they left for basic training at Fort Dix together in 1969, and served in Vietnam together.

Brenda read a note from Carroll and Dot thanking CVMC members for their love and support during Carroll's convalescence. They have really appreciated all the cards and telephone calls from friends expressing their care and concern.

Treasurer George Cosier reported a beginning balance of \$1162.26 plus \$435 (dues, registration, sponsors) plus \$422 (show) minus \$31.13 (flowers) minus 241.31 (printing newsletters, show flyers) minus \$53 (signs for VBS) plus \$100 (registrations) minus \$22.10 (phone) minus \$1209.07 (trophies) plus \$1468 (registrations) minus \$200 (cash for show) minus \$179.88 (newspaper ads) plus \$660.50 (show) plus \$76.80 (zoo trip deposit) minus \$184.54 (printing programs, judges sheets) minus \$412 (zoo trip) for a final balance of \$1794.83.

The car show in September took in a total of \$3157, had expenditures of \$1692 for a total balance of \$1465. We received a refund check in the amount of \$163 from JC Taylor, the insurance company.

The money from the 50/50 raffle in the account. The money was intended to be donated to the Virginia Blood Service, but they only wanted the magnetic signs that we donated to them, not cash. Brenda made a motion that the raffle money be donated to the Red Cross for use for Hurricane Floyd victims in Franklin, Virginia. This was seconded, but upon discussion it was learned that once money is donated to the Red Cross, there is no control over where that money might be spent. Fred from the Virginia Car Council had information on a benefit car show being held in Hopewell on October 17 where the benefits will go directly to the local government in Franklin. He thought perhaps we would like to make a donation at the car show, in the presence of other car clubs to show our support. The decision was made to get the information on where to send the donation and mail the donation directly to the local government in Franklin ourselves. The motion was withdrawn.

National Director Paul Oliver reported that 24 units of blood were donated at our car show. He also reported that one person personally thanked the VBS for possible saving his life last year. This person donated blood and within a few days received a letter from VBS stating that his blood sample tested positive for hepatitis and he should consult his family physician for further testing and treatment. He consulted his physician and is now being treated for hepatitis. Without early intervention, hepatitis is potentially fatal.

Kenny discussed upcoming car shows. The season typically ends in October. The first show of the year 2000 should be the Asphalt Angel show at The ShowPlace in February, usually Valentine's Day weekend.

Lew discussed upcoming parades. There will be a parade on October 23 in Bon Air. There were no interested members at the meeting, so Lew will decline the entry. Richard Dawson has been seeking cars for this weekend's Autumn Harvest Parade. Next year the Autumn Harvest Parade will be held on October 14 and car clubs will be allowed to participate as a group, instead of merely providing convertibles for dignitaries to ride in. The Richmond Christmas Parade does not allow car clubs to



participate. Lew has not yet received information concerning the Ashland Christmas Parade (probably November 21) or the Chester Christmas Parade (scheduled for December 12).

Nellie has CVMC merchandise for sale. The Holiday Party is scheduled for Friday, December 10, at the King's Charter clubhouse.

Kenny thanked everyone for working to make our car show a success. There is no post-show meeting scheduled to discuss improvements for next year. There were some display plaques "left over", if anyone did not receive theirs.

The bus trip to the National Zoo is scheduled for this Saturday. There are 2 seats still available. Fees should be paid to George tonight. We will leave the Park-N-Ride at Parham and Fordson at 8 AM and return before 8 PM. Presumably, we will then go somewhere for dinner.

Adopt-A-Highway is scheduled for Saturday, November 13. Meet at the Midlothian K-Mart at 9:30 AM. Lunch will follow at the Pizza Hut.

Kenny asked for volunteers to serve on the Election Committee. Joan Tucker and Karen Lane volunteered. Elections will be held for all of the Officers positions and 4 Directors. The election will be held at the December meeting. Kenny will get current membership lists to the committee for their telephone solicitations. Currently, there are 83 paid members.

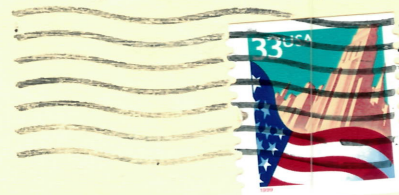
