
Presidential Perspective

His son, Seth, and daughter, Sarah, will help him restore the car.

Susan Morris reported 58 paid members. Please pay up! Annual membership dues are payable in January. She also listed the April birthdays for club members.

Treasurer Karen Lane reported a beginning balance of \$2162.37 plus \$181.00 (dues) minus \$24.24 (phone) minus \$52.94 (cards & postage) minus \$42.40 (flowers) minus \$90.00 (Pizza Hut) for a final balance of \$2133.79.

There has been no news from the folks who organize the cruise at Garden Ridge. In their inaugural year, the cruises started in mid-May. Cruises at Zero's in Hopewell will begin May 6 and cruises at Honeybee's, also in Hopewell, should be starting soon.

Head Judge Steve Shaver recently received a telephone call from Jack Basic, National Assistant Head Judge for MCA. The kick-off MCA show for 2000 was held at the end of March in Pensacola, FL. There was an overwhelming number of 3rd and 4th Generation Mustangs (1979 – present), enough for a separate car show, and too few judges available. Jack was requesting some volunteers to judge or to be judge's assistants from our club because he knows we generally have a good showing at National MCA shows that are fairly close to Richmond. Don & Karen Lane participated in the MCA National show in Pensacola with their '65 fastback and received a Gold Award.

Brenda Jones gave a medical report on Carroll Lipscombe. He fell recently and is now in HealthSouth Medical Center in the Intensive Care Unit with what was originally diagnosed as pneumonia. Apparently the pneumonia cultures came back negative so the doctors have done tests to determine what is affecting his lungs, but the results won't be received for a couple of days.
