held on 11/07/01 at Richmond Motor Co.

President George Cosier called the meeting to order at 7:28 p.m. All officers were present except for Susan Morris, Debbie Shaver and Mike Young. We had 1 visitor, Angie who has a 2001 cobra.

Karen gave a Treasurer's report. We started out the month with a balance of \$2,157.37. We had deposits totaling \$138.00 and expenses totaling \$889.92, leaving us a balance of \$1405.45, at the end of October. One of the expenses was for the New York Relief Fund, which we sent \$675.50. This was from the 50/50 and the silent auction at the car show.

George read a letter from the Virginia Blood Service thanking us for our Contributions at the show. We gave 30 pints and they saved 90 lives with the Donations.

George gave a report on the car club council's meeting last week. The DEQ (emission testing) tried to hold 2 meetings to discuss getting emission testing here in Richmond. Nobody showed up at either meeting. They have decided to adopt the EPA rulings on smaller emissions producers, like lawnmowers, string cutters, marine engines large equipment etc. instead of going after the cars right now.


