






OUR TRIP TO WHITE POST RESTORATIONS

A cold and windy day in November was the beginning of a fantastic day trip to White Post Restorations. About 20 members and friends of the Central VA Mustang Club gathered at Willow Lawn Shopping



Center at 8:30 a.m. and left at 9:00 a.m. for a 3 hour drive to White Post, VA. The group was lead by Herbert Hudson and Jimmy Clements by virtue of the fact that Herbert had been there before. There were no problems encountered on the trip up and only two bathroom and gas stops were needed to reach our



destination.

After finding the place with an hour to spare, we went to McDonalds for a snack. Upon returning, we were greeted by Billy Thompson, owner and the second of


four generations to work the family business. He explained that his father began the business in the 1940's and his son and grandson continue it now. We were shown the "Accounts Receivable" shed containing about 18 cars in various states of being restored. Cars currently there included a 1938 Scarab of which six were built, 4 exist now and this one was a parts car for one of the other ones there. They will do a complete frame off, hand making any pieces they cannot locate. Rates are \$65.00 an hour with up to 5,000 hours needed for some cars.

We were taken to every phase of the restoration and shown how parts are cataloged and kept in order. Quality is unsurpassed and only one person works an entire car at one time. There are 27 employees and some have been there for 30 years. The tour lasted 1 1/2 hours, including a video explaining most phases of



a restoration and that only complete restorations are done. We were truly awed and inspired to rethink some of our own current projects.

We left White Post at about 3:00 p.m. and those not having to return to Richmond continued on to Hosses Steak House for a really great meal. We finished at about 4:30 p.m. and headed back to Richmond with Linda, Linda's mother, and I stopping off at Warrington to visit with my mother. 
The Club Christmas Party
