Carl Platt's Restored '66 Convertible

The Perfect Daily Driver

Did you ever wonder what near-perfection might look like? Look no further than Carl Platt's '66 Mustang convertible. This car combines some of the early Mustang's most desirable features, and it really knocks your socks off in the fit-and-finish department.



The car didn't always look so good, however. It had deteriorated to the point of being what Carl called a "total wreck." Carl latched on to the car 10 years ago and began the laborious process of restoration. It would have been hard to find a car more worthy for restoration. This one has several attributes that make it especially sought after. Of course, being a Mustang is reason enough, but who could pass up a Candy Apple Red convertible?



Besides the terrific original color, the red ride was outfitted with an A-code four-barrel 289 V-8 for power. This represents a considerable upgrade in power over the C-code two-barrel or base six-cylinder engines. The engine in Carl's rig was freshened up for the refurbishment with a complete rebuild. It is backed by the venerable C-4 three-speed Cruise-O-Matic transmission.

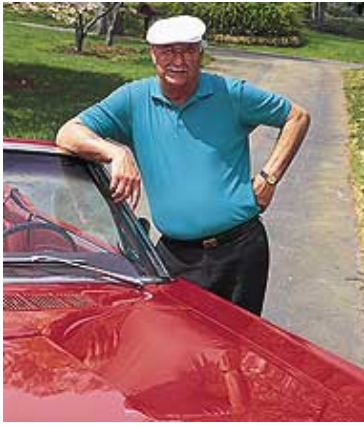


Other interesting features found on the outside of the car include styled-steel wheels, a GT light bar out front, and true dual exhaust with trumpets and bezels out back. These goodies were dealership-installed when the car was new. All this goes along nicely with the optional 289-4V engine and leads one to suspect that the original owner wanted true GT performance while preserving the smoother ride quality found on non-GT cars.



Although these enhancements conspire to make this a beautiful car on the outside, the interior appointments shine brightly as well. Just the red pony interior would be enough to spiff up the car's inner world, but this Mustang is embellished with other great interior appointments. You don't have to look hard to notice the Rally-Pac mounted on the steering column. The interior also includes a full factory console and a rare optional wood grain steering wheel. A factory steering wheel of this type will set you back a bundle for an original if you can find one, and they are highly sought after by those of us stuck with the plain-Jane's.

We can tell you that a complete restoration project can be a long and difficult undertaking, and we admire anyone who completes one as beautiful as this. Carl really enjoyed "breathing new life" into his sweet '66 convertible and plans to keep the car in excellent condition. In addition to top-down motoring anytime he likes, Carl enjoys showing the car and rubbing elbows with other Mustang enthusiasts. The first-generation Mustang, when in convertible form, may have been the most exciting car of the day and perhaps of all time. We just can't find anyone who wouldn't love to own one as well restored as Carl's. He plans to give the car to his two sons someday. We guess they'll have to flip a coin for the keys.

## A View From The Inside... SVT

Greetings Richard and all CVMC members!

"Breakthroughs" on Mustang? Whew, where do I start? I guess the beginning is the best place. There's a ton of history so I'll try to hit on some of the significant highlights of this great American classic that has been in existence for over 38 years. (That's right, I said 38 years!) I'll stick with the factory stuff since the Shelby offerings are a whole other great story unto themselves.



**1964** Ford Motor Company introduces its newest creation... The 1964 1/2 Ford Mustang. Phrases like "overwhelming success" and "overnight sensation" are common throughout the auto industry that year when the word "Mustang" comes up.

**1967** Big block power becomes available in the Mustang in the 390 cu. in. GT and GT-A model. Uh Ho Ho! (Apologies to Tim Allen)

**1968** Excuse me Mr. salesman? Did you say I could get a 428 Cobra Jet in the new Mustang? (Uh, honey? Leave that Galaxy Ranch wagon alone and come here a minute will ya please?)

**1969** The Mach One and the venerable Boss 302 debut. (Can it get any better?)

**1970** Mustang adds a Boss 429 (!) to its line up of already great tire shredding power train combinations. (I guess it does!)

**1971** A new Boss in town? Ford adds the 351 'Cleveland' to its line up. Also available as the "Boss 351" model. The Boss 302 and Boss 429 unfortunately exit the scene.

**1974 - 1978** A new nimbler platform billed as "the right car at the right time", the Ford Mustang II debuts. Purists cringe. Tree huggers delight. The first 4-cylinder (no, that's not a typo either) 2.3L OHC engine becomes the standard power plant. ("Power" plant?)

**1979** The new 'fox' body makes it debut. Waning interest in an old friend is rekindled thanks to turbocharged availability on the 2.3L as well as a trusty 302 V8.

**1982** Mustang GT is reintroduced with an aggressive front fascia and hood scoop, a 2V 302 V8, fatter tires, a dual inlet snorkel air cleaner, and a (gulp!) twin tipped single exhaust.

**1983** Honest to goodness 4-barrel power on the GT Mustang. (We're getting warm...)

**1984-1992** The Mustang GT continues to flourish with cool things like dual exhaust, quad shocks, and bigger and better brakes to name a few. (You're getting warmer...)

**1993** Enter Ford's Special Vehicle Team and the Mustang Cobra becomes the first SVT product to hit the showrooms. (Remember, the Lightning was not technically an SVT product in 1993) A limited version (107 I believe) Cobra R model was also unleashed that year. (Now you're talking...)

**1994** The much-ballyhooed SN95 Mustang finally arrives! Killer sweeping looks coupled with a hot 5.0L V8? How could Ford go wrong? It didn't.

**1995** 250 units of the 1995 Cobra R models become available for those lucky enough to have a racing license. (Hey, it wasn't my idea...) Get 'em in any color as long as it's white with tan interior. (Time to go racing!)

**1996** An old friend passes. The beloved pushrod reluctantly steps aside for the new generation modular OHC 4.6L V8. Available in 2-valve per cylinder on the GT and 4 valves per cylinder in the Cobra. As expected, mixed reviews from the die-hards, but power junkies love the look, sound, and smooth feel of modular performance. (Hey, 305 hp is hard to ignore...)

**1999** The next evolution begins with a completely redesigned body for Mustang. Road racers and chassis freaks delight in a fully independent rear suspension (IRS) as standard equipment on the 1999 Cobra. Quality and power output issues surface on the Cobra and SVT aggressively steps up to make amends. All Cobras are retrofitted with upgrade kits that include, a new intake manifold (sans casting flash) new mufflers (with the correct backpressure) and a revised power train calibration. A decision is made to cancel production of the 2000 Cobra until quality concerns can be corrected. Customers are annoyed at having to wait at having to wait for their vehicles. Dealers are not amused by lost revenues.

**2000** Despite the horsepower turmoil, SVT produces 300 units of the Mustang Cobra R. 385 horses of 5.4L DOHC engine stuffed into the engine bay with a T56 6 speed behind it is no small feat. Gutted of non-essentials like A/C, radio, back seat, etc. it's the hottest, fastest, best handling factory Mustang produced to date. This however comes at a price. At \$55,000 it's also the most expensive Mustang ever built. (But man, are these an absolute kick to drive fast!) A 'full spectrum' of color choices are available once again on the R model, as long as it's performance red. Many people don't realize that the Cobra R was the only Cobra available for 2000.

**2001** Quality and power concerns now corrected, the long awaited Mustang SVT Cobra returns to the Ford stable for 2001. Owners and dealers rejoice! The one-year only limited production Bullitt model is introduced. A great exhaust sound, bitchin' looks, and handling that the late Steve McQueen would have loved while dogging those bad guys in the black 68 Charger. (I say we're overdue for a sequel) Available in green, black or blue, they went fast. No pun intended.



**2003** Uh, Mr. Coletti, you want to do what? SVT introduces the supercharged 2003 Cobra. The first application of supercharged power in the Mustang platform. 390 horsepower and 390lb/ft of asphalt torturing torque. An Eaton roots type supercharger, cast iron block, and Manley connecting rods w/ ARP fasteners, new improved flow cylinder heads, 6 speed T56 manual transmission, fat 275 Goodyear F1 tires, great brakes, seats, and styling. Question now is... what will we do for an encore? You'll have to stay tuned for that chapter. I likely missed a few points in the evolution of the Mustang, but I think you get my drift. This is a great car! An American icon with a cult like status. It's survived multiple Presidents, CEO's at Ford, a couple of wars, numerous economic swings, and a whole host of changes to its own being. Is the Mustang different today than the first generation car? Certainly. Has the spirit of the Mustang changed? Never.
