The election also brought about some other changes to the Officers and Directors of the CVMC. Congratulations to each of you and thank you for volunteering your time and effort.

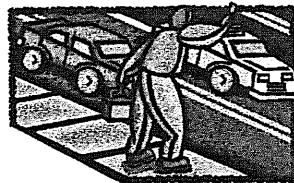

Please note that starting on April 1, 2002 the membership fees will be increased to \$25.00.

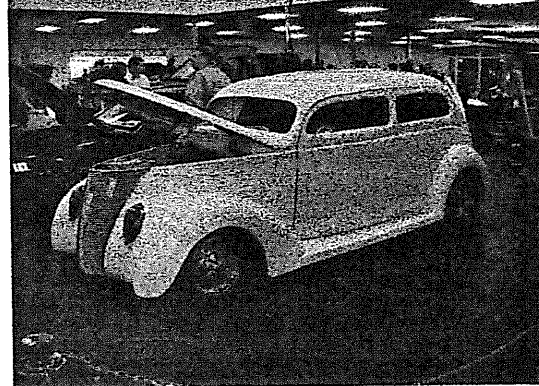
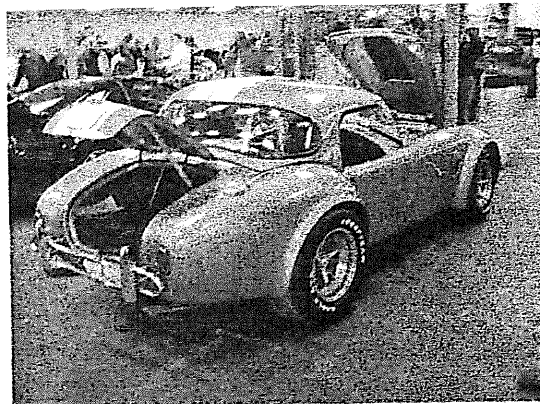
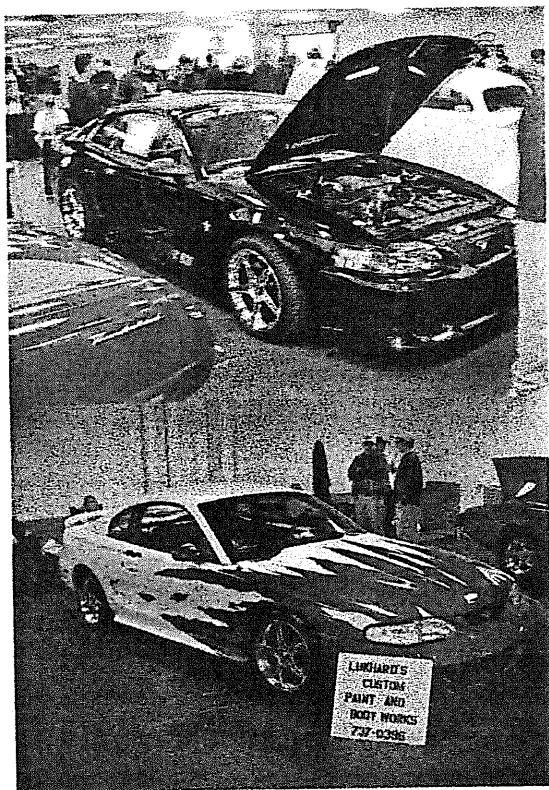

Tony asked if there were any volunteers to take over the show chairman's job since Mike Young has had to give this position up. Kenny Fischer was nominated and appointed to the position. Mike has said that he would help with trophies but just didn't want the whole position.

Kim McDaniel & Linda Cosier will be co-chairing the Picnics and Parties committee since Donna Young has resigned. Tyler Owen talked about setting up a web page for the club. We found there were several domain names we could have and decided on Central VA Mustang.com. Tyler said it would cost \$40.00 a year for the page and \$35.00 a year to register the name. 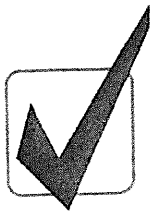
