

Minutes of Meeting,
August 7, 2002

1st V. P. George Bobrovsky due to President Tony Hall still recuperating from surgery called meeting to order. George called to the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. George then gave an update on Tony. He was in intensive care for a couple of days, but everything turned out fine with the surgery. George talked to a representative from Richmond Ford. They have asked us not to park in the customers parking area in front. They also do not know yet if we will still be able to meet at the building when the new owners take over.

George asked if we had any visitors: We had 4. Arthur Case (86 mustang conv.), Mr. Bray (98 Cobra), Scott Bynes (65 must. Conv, 66 Must. Conv.), Dave Pidet (97 must. Conv.). Welcome to everyone.

Karen gave the Treasurers Report. We started the month with a balance of \$2473.49. We had income/deposits of \$472.00, which gave us a balance of \$2945.49. We had expenses of \$482.61, which leaves us with a balance of \$2462.88. We are \$1100.00 ahead of where we were last year. We have 88 paid members.

Kenny gave a Car Show report -- Mike Young is supposed to be contacting the Parts Vendors, so Kenny doesn't know about that part. Dash plaques have been ordered, Kenny passed around a black & white picture. Sponsorship of trophies classes are as follows: 1st 71-73 year, Best of Show Early Mustang, Best of Show Late model, 1st, 2nd, 3rd - 65,66 years. 1st, 2nd, 3rd SVO, Cobra, 1st, 2nd,

3rd 94-98 years Cost to sponsor a class is \$100.00

Head Judge - Don Lane He has a 2 part sheet. Sheet will be done so we can make notes on what we find wrong.

We need 4 to 5 people to handle registration, we need to number the spaces, and we need a public address system. We also are going to need generators to run various things and to provide power to the trailer.

George noted that both the Stony Point Shopping Center and Short Pump Town Center are scheduled to open in September of 2003. 
