





CVMC Cruise In @ Market Café – July 10th! CVMC had a great turn out for our Cruise In at Market Café in Innsbrook.


I believe we had over 25 Mustangs and a Cobra through out the day. It was a really good mix of Mustangs.


Larry Boyd's house is located at 11010 Nash Road. His phone number is 804-748-2272

New for the 2006 Mustang

"Pony Package" offers Mustang V-6 customers a GT-inspired suspension with larger wheels and tires, ABS and traction control, custom grille with fog lamps and Pony Emblems.

Mustang GT now available with four distinct wheel- and -tire combinations, including two all-new 18-inch wheels and tires complemented by unique suspension tuning.

Two new colors include Vista Blue Clearcoat Metallic and Tungsten Grey Clearcoat Metallic, first shown on the 2004 NAIAS Mustang show car

Later in the model year, an additional, darker aluminum interior upgrade option will become available.

Overview

Since its dramatic 1964 introduction, Ford Mustang has been the icon of American performance with its bold style, brawny engine and rear-wheel-drive excitement, earning its place as the top-selling sports car for 19 years straight. For 2006, Ford is building on the clean-sheet 2005 design by offering a V-6 "Pony Package," 18-inch wheels on GT models, a pair of new colors and, later in the model year, a darker aluminum interior upgrade option.

Since its all-new 2005 redesign, Mustang has won dozens of accolades including "Most Significant Vehicle" from Edmunds.com, "Official Car of Summer" from Outside magazine as well as listing in AutoWeek's top 10 cars and Ward's Auto World's 10 best engines.

Mustang is one of the greatest automotive sales success stories of all time. Nearly one out of every two sports cars sold in America this year has been a Mustang. The car garnered more than two times as many sales as its closest competitor in the small specialty segment, which features sports coupes such as the Pontiac GTO, Nissan 350Z, Chrysler Sebring and Hyundai Tiburon. It's also America's best-selling convertible.

For 2006, Ford Mustang will offer customers more customization potential with the all-new "Pony Package," providing Mustang V-6 customers a GT-inspired suspension with larger wheels and tires, custom grille with fog lamps and other enhancements.

Mustang GT customers can now also choose between four different wheel and tire packages, including two new 18-inch wheels and tires complemented by unique suspension tuning. In addition, two new Mustang colors - Vista Blue Clearcoat Metallic and Tungsten Grey Clearcoat Metallic - join the color palette for 2006.

Mustang comes in Standard, Deluxe and Premium packages (Deluxe and Premium only for GT models) in a choice of coupe or convertible with a V-6 or V-8 engine mated to a 5-speed manual or automatic transmission. It is built in Flat Rock, Mich.

Design and Equipment

Mustang is pure American muscle. The signature long hood and short rear deck capitalize on 40 years of history, as do classic design cues that have defined Mustangs since the 1960s: C-scoops in the sides, three-element taillamps and a galloping horse badge in the center of the grille. The Mustang's menacing shark-like nose imparts an attitude not seen since the 1967 model, while jeweled, round headlamps in trapezoidal housings are part of its striking new modern architecture. The car's aggressive rake gives the design visual motion while the short overhangs anchor it visually and physically to the road.

The new-for-2006 V-6 "Pony Package" includes a customized grille with GT-style round fog lamps and a chrome bezel or "corral" around the traditional Mustang prancing horse. Backing up this visual upgrade is a GT-inspired suspension featuring a larger front stabilizer bar, the addition of a rear stabilizer bar and P235/55ZR17 tires on painted cast-aluminum wheels. With bright machined rims and unique tri-bar Pony center caps, these are the largest wheels and tires ever fitted to a V-6 Mustang.

Further touches include Pony front fender badges, lower door tape stripe, carpeted front floor mats with special brushed chrome "Mustang" logos and a rear spoiler. Four-wheel disc brakes with anti-lock braking system (ABS) and traction control are also part of the package.

In the 2006 model year, Mustang GT also will have two new 18-inch wheel and tire combinations - the largest tires ever fitted to a production V-8 Mustang since the 2000 SVT Cobra R model - and unique suspension tuning calibrated to the larger treads. Mustang GT customers will be able to choose from four wheel- and -tire combinations.

Inside, the industry-first, color-configurable instrument panel offers the ultimate in personalization. Mustang owners can mix and match lighting at the touch of a button to create more than 125 different color backgrounds to suit their personality, mood, outfit or whim.

Modern touches mix with Mustang history and heritage. Chrome-ringed air vents are aligned vertically across the dash, precisely in line with the gauges, and the steering wheel has three spokes with a center hub marked by the horse and tricolor bars logo, echoing the design of the 1967 Mustang.

Numerous standard features include one-touch up/down power windows, power mirrors, keyless entry and power locks, a heated rear window, interval wipers, air conditioning, speed control and CD player.

Powertrain and Chassis

Muscular engines infuse Mustang with tire-smoking performance. The 4.6-liter aluminum V-8 has three-valve heads and cranks out 300 horsepower. That's more than 50 percent more power than the small-block 289-cubic-inch V-8 found in the classic 1964 model.

The standard engine, a 60-degree 4.0-liter SOHC V-6, produces 210 horsepower and 240 pound-feet of torque.

Five-speed manual transmissions are standard. The V-8 powered GT is equipped with a rugged Tremec 3650 gearbox, while V-6 uses the proven Tremec T-5. Since 2005, Mustang has been available with a five-speed automatic which provides a unique combination of off-the-line jump and good highway fuel economy.

At the front suspension, MacPherson struts with reverse "L" lower control arms deliver both comfort and control. The three-link rear suspension has a lightweight, tubular Panhard rod that provides precise control of the rear axle. This technology stabilizes the rear axle as the wheels move, particularly during hard cornering.

The standard four-wheel disc brakes have the biggest rotors and stiffest calipers ever fitted to a mainstream Mustang. Twin-piston aluminum calipers clamp down on 12.4-inch ventilated front brake discs on GT models.

In the rear, the brake rotors are 11.8 inches in diameter - more than 12 percent larger than on the 2004 model.

A four-channel anti-lock braking system with traction control is available for a greater degree of brake control. It uses electronic sensors to constantly monitor road conditions and feed the information to a dedicated control computer capable of determining, within milliseconds, whether the vehicle is on dry pavement or negotiating a slippery surface. When traction control isn't desired, drivers can deactivate the system with a simple button on the instrument panel.

Safety and Security

With power comes responsibility. The 2006 Mustang helps occupants stay safe.

Ford's Personal Safety System™, a comprehensive safety technology package, is standard. The system provides increased protection in frontal crashes by analyzing crash factors and determining the proper response within milliseconds. It uses dual-stage driver and front-passenger air bags - capable of deploying at full or partial power - safety belt pretensioners and energy management retractors.

NEWS FROM THE CCCCVA

Well we have both a governor and a president that can't seem to be able to ride bicycles without having accidents. We can be thankful that despite more drivers and more vehicles on the roads the number of accidents, injuries and deaths are going down. In fact Virginia has almost 100 fewer deaths from traffic accidents than this time last year. Perhaps the gov and the president should go to driving school.

Last month I wrote about the energy bill before Congress. Both houses have agreed to a bill and they have removed all liability protection for the makers of MTBE. This was the big sticking point as some in Congress wanted to saddle the MTBE clean up with we taxpayers. MTBE, a gasoline additive that was supposed to help clean the air, has poisoned ground water in many states. Some people have reported health problems associated with exposure to MTBE. More than 150 lawsuits have been filed to try and force the oil companies to clean up the MTBE mess. Of course the oil companies will pass those costs on to us at the pump - so either way we lose.

Congress has also come up with a measure to make driver licenses more secure. The states are looking at this as an un-funded mandate. They don't have the estimated \$900 million it will take to put this into practice. The Virginia DMV expects the cost of a license to triple and for there to be long lines due to all the paperwork needed to process a license. A couple of states say they are not going to participate due to the costs. The problem is that unless you have a federal approved license by mid-2008 you won't be able to get on a plane. The airlines are forced by law to only accept the new licenses for identification.

The Richmond newspaper jumped the gun on an article about Richmond air quality. The article bragged about how the air has been fairly clean for the last couple of years. Now with the heat wave that may change. At least the article does state that ozone and air quality are directly related to the weather. It's just too bad the EPA hasn't realized this. If we have several bad ozone days the EPA has said they will force the Richmond area to do automobile emissions testing. Why punish people because the weather is hot and stagnant for a few days?

I'm sure you've heard about the bill Senator George Allen is sponsoring about anti-freeze. His bill, if it becomes law, would force anti-freeze makers to add a bitter agent to the anti-freeze. Anti-freeze tastes very sweet and thousands of dogs, cats and kids have become ill or died after drinking it. Prestone, one of the leading makers of anti-freeze, told members of the senate that it would cost three cents a gallon to add the bitter agent. So if it only costs three cents a gallon why haven't they already added it? Why do they have to wait for an act of

Congress to make them save the lives of thousands of pets and children? And if Allen's bill becomes law I predict two things will happen. One, the price of anti-freeze will increase by a lot more than three cents a gallon. Two, we will have to suffer with anti-freeze ads that state how concerned they are with our pets and children and that is the reason they've come out with this new, improved and safer anti-freeze.
