BILL FORD: THROUGH INNOVATION, AMERICA CAN ADDRESS MANUFACTURING, ENERGY CHALLENGES

Unveils six broad initiatives to secure America's energy and manufacturing future Challenges industry and government to respond to 'economic challenges of our time'

WASHINGTON, DC, Nov. 22, 2005, In a speech before the Business Roundtable, Ford Chairman and Chief Executive Officer Bill Ford talked about the energy and manufacturing challenges facing our country and how industry and government can overcome them by investing again in American innovation.

"Now, more than ever, with the competitive pressures of globalization, America needs to respond to the economic challenges of our time," said Ford. "This is not the moment to stop investing and concede our competitive edge in vital parts of the economy. Just the opposite, we must take the lead and show the world that there is only one, true innovative manufacturing giant. And it has three distinct initials: U.S.A. "

He said that other countries have made manufacturing important enough to make it a national priority and called upon the US to do the same. "It ultimately means more jobs, more tax revenue, and a position of strength and leadership in the world."

The Ford CEO outlined six cooperative measures between industry and government that America can take in the short term that will "bear fruit for years to come." The six measures include:

1. Urging Congress to invest in America and dramatically increase the R&D tax credit to more directly support companies working on advanced vehicles, components, and fuel technologies.
2. Challenging Congress to consider tax incentives to help American manufacturers convert existing -- but outmoded plants -- into high-tech facilities.
3. Calling for investment in the American workers who build the advanced technology products with training programs and incentives to upgrade worker skills, helping us move into the future while preserving American jobs.
4. Pushing governments at all levels by 2010 to consider buying only hybrids or other alternatively fueled vehicles.
5. Expanding the infrastructure for ethanol fuels — so we can go from hundreds of fuel stations to thousands.
6. Convening a group of automakers, suppliers, fuel providers and government agencies to address America's energy challenges.

"I believe that with the right investments, America - and the American manufacturing sector - can win. It can maintain its leadership stature in the world. And we can reduce our dependence on foreign oil. All at the same time. But we can't get there alone."

Ford said it is difficult to conceive of any issue that touches more of our lives than energy. "It drives our mobility, our appliances and our choices about how far we can live from our jobs. It affects our environment, our national security and our household budgets. And when the price of gas goes up to \$3 a gallon, as it did just a few months ago, all Americans feel it in their pocketbooks. And from where I sit, as Chairman of Ford Motor Company, it affects the decisions I make every day."

Ford noted that when he became CEO in 2001, he made a conscious decision to invest in new products that were more fuel efficient. "I believed back then that the days of cheap gasoline were numbered. That led to the creation of the world's first hybrid-electric SUV, the Ford Escape, and inspired our decision to build up to 250,000 hybrids a year by 2010."

He reminded the Business Roundtable audience that despite recent industry challenges, domestic auto manufacturers are still the foundation of the auto industry in this country. "We still employ nearly 90% of the workers in our industry. And since 1980, we've made more than 85% of the total investments in the U.S. auto industry -- \$175 billion."

NEWS FROM THE CCCCVA

I hope you saw some of the exchanges between the big oil executives and members of Congress. It might surprise you that big oil execs got hauled before Congress. It's a well known fact that oil companies and their employees have given millions to members of Congress for campaigns and via lobbyists. But the Republican leadership had to call them before Congress because their polling numbers were very low due to the rapid rise in gasoline prices (and profits) at the time of hurricane Katrina. ExxonMobil announced \$9.9 billion in third quarter profits - a US record for corporations. And the top four big oil companies are expected to make over \$100 billion in profits for 2005.

Having \$2.6 billion in tax breaks for big oil in the recent energy bill didn't help. Letting big oil use federal land - including military bases - to build refineries in another bill didn't help either. But recently Congress has turned its back on big oil as the House voted no to drilling in the Artic Wildlife Refuge.

The big oil execs even refused to testify under oath at the hearing. And they evaded answering the tough questions. They also refused to use even a fraction of their record profits to help poor people with heating this winter. Many think that because of the rise in heating oil products that the poor will have a hard time keeping warm this winter.

The American people don't really like big oil. In fact most believe that after Katrina that big oil gouged the prices at the pumps to make more money. Most Americans favor some type of windfall profit tax on big oil. There are (at this writing) eight pieces of legislation in Congress to further tax oil profits or to control in some way oil prices and profits.

This is despite big oil spending millions in Congress that helped them reap profits in the billions. If there was such a severe shortage of gasoline after Katrina that the price had to go up then why do the oil company profits go up by an even larger margin? It was a question the execs avoided.

There is also legislation not only in Congress but in state houses to allow off-shore drilling especially for natural gas. This is in response to the big increase in natural gas prices.

No doubt you have seen the big decrease in gasoline prices lately - and this is despite the fact that not all refineries are up and running. Do you think that the recent Congressional hearings with the big oil execs and the public turning against big oil's huge profits had anything to do with the fall in gas prices?

Citizens are now (finally) getting fed up with some of the stuff going on in Congress and they are letting their representatives know. One town actually offered to give up a pork barrel transportation project if the money would go to help Hurricane Katrina victims. And now the famous \$230 million dollar bridge in Alaska that would go to an island of 50 people (only \$4.6 million per person) has been canned. They also cut another \$229 million for a bridge that would have been named after Representative Don Young of Alaska. Alaska will keep the funds but they will actually be used for needed projects. Are the people getting their government back?

RICK'S TIP'S

Winterize Time!

Gas can go bad! When it does it will become thick and gooeey similar to Molasses. It can also dry and become solid similar to a yellow varnish. The only way to remove gas when it has solidified is to soak it in a strong acid or replace the parts where the gas has dried. In other words if it dries then the tank, tank sender, fuel lines and carburetor may need to be replaced. Carburetors are almost certainly ruined.

To prevent this a product called Stabill can be added to the gas tank and will keep the gas in the tank, lines and carburetor good for a couple of months. I personally like to run my cars at least once a month replacing the Stabill each time after they are run.

You can find Stabill at Home Depot in the small engine section.
